Because I have ideas, I have a purpose and I will live my life like Jesus.


Christ is invisible, we cannot show him our love. But our neighbours are always visible and we can do for them what we would like to do for Him if he were visible.

Supporting Healthy Schools

Children Need to be Physically Active to Learn and Grow.

Sweat and step guidelines for children 5 to 17 years of age:

Every day children should get:

- 60 minutes of an activity that will cause them to sweat and breathe harder, plus
- several hours of light physical activies.

Encourage children to do things that will strengthen their muscles and bones at least 3 days per week.

Help children be physically active with these tips:

- Role model by being an active parent.
- Plan physically active events for the family.
- Encourage children to walk or ride a bike to school.

What Immunizations Are Given to Grade 7 Students in School?

Grade 7 students have the opportunity to receive up to three vaccines at school at no cost:

- Hepatitis B
- · Human Papillomavirus (HPV)
- Meningococcal ACYW-135

Hepatitis B and HPV are optional vaccines.

Meningococcal vaccine is mandatory for students to attend school in Ontario.

Immunization information and consent forms are sent home in early September.



Measuring Up

Measurement is a math concept children learn about at home and school. Measurement includes understanding length, mass, volume, perimeter, area, temperature, time and speed.

You can help preschool and school age children understand measurement by helping them learn to use measurement vocabulary. Words such as short/long, heavy/light, full/empty, big/small, hot/cold, early/late, fast/slow help them compare things in their everyday world.
