We look forward to a great year in this exceptional learning and faith community.



~Safe Arrival Program~ Every School Day Counts

Parents/guardians are asked to call the school at **613-389-1891** whenever your child will be late or absent. A message may be left at any time on the answering machine. Please indicate your child's name, grade and teacher and your name. If no call is received, office staff will use the contact information provided to locate the child or the parent regarding the absence.

Signing In and Signing Out

A form is in the office for parents/guardians to sign in their child when they are arriving late and sign out when they are picking up their child early. *Please do not take your child off the school yard*. Staff will call them to the office to meet you.

Lunch Time ...

Please notify the school **in writing** if your child will be regularly walking home for lunch. All students are expected to stay at school throughout the lunch hour.

Changes in After School Routine

Any changes in your child's regular bus or pick up routine should be relayed to the office at least a day in advance when possible. If last minute changes are required, please call the school **before 1:00** to ensure the message gets to your child. **Do not leave a message on the answering machine regarding changes in your child's end of day routine.**

Working Together for School Safety

The safety of our students is a priority. In order to maintain a safe environment for our children, staff will address all unidentified adults. While no parent/guardian considers themselves a stranger to our school, many children will not know your identity and will point you out as a stranger.

Parents/guardians and visitors can help us keep our children safe by following these practices:

- Staff are on duty in the morning and after school to meet the buses and supervise the yard. **Please do not leave your child in the yard before supervision begins at 8:55 in the morning**.
- All parents/guardians, visitors, and non-school personnel are required to enter the school by the main doors and come directly to the main office to sign in. These doors are locked and are equipped with a monitoring system which require staff to open the doors for you. Our office staff will happily assist you.
- Unauthorized parents/guardians and visitors are not permitted in the hallways or the school yard during school hours.
- Teachers will gladly meet with parents/guardians during set times. Conversations during class time or supervision prevent staff from giving our students their full attention.
- The beginning and ending of the day are extremely busy times. Please abide by signage posted for our bus drop off / pick up lane in front of the school.
- In order to keep the halls and foyer clear and safe at dismissal times, parents/guardians picking up children should wait outside the main doors. Our Kindergarten students will be dismissed by our staff at the outside Kindergarten gate entrance and students from Grades one to eight will be dismissed from the main doors. A staff member will assist in dismissing students from Grades 1-3 at the main door.

Please review, update and return your child's *Student Information Form* to the school by **Monday, October 1**st, **2018.** If at any time through the school year this information should change please notify the office immediately.

Anaphylaxis

We have several students in our school with life threatening allergies to nuts and peanuts. Eating or touching nuts, peanuts, and food containing nuts and peanuts can result in serious health complications. As parents, we all understand the intense concern anaphylaxis can cause and as a school community we will work together to reduce the possibility of exposure to allergens at school. Please continue to pack snack and lunch items that do not contain or possibly have traces of nuts, peanuts, and nut products. Should your child

inadvertently bring one of these items, he/she will be asked to leave it in his/her lunch box and an alternate snack will be offered.

Thank you by showing your care and concern for all our children by helping to provide a safe learning environment.





Medication

It is important that the school is aware if your child has a severe medical condition. School staff may only administer medication to students with written authorization from the parent/guardian **and** the prescribing physician. If you have not already received forms for 2018-19, please contact the school to discuss your child's medical condition and to obtain the **Medical Information**

Forms. Please promptly return to the office so we can develop your child's Medical

Care Plan.

Student Agendas

Agendas are excellent tools by which students develop their organizational skills. They also provide an avenue for ongoing communication between home and school. Students from Kindergarten to 8 will be provided with an agenda to use on a daily basis. The cost of the agenda is **\$7.00.** Thank you to our School Council for offsetting the cost of our student agendas.

Appropriate Dress

Students are expected to be dressed in a respectful manner that reflects our Catholic values. Please review our Archbishop O'Sullivan Catholic School Code of Conduct located on our school website and in your child's agenda. We ask parents/guardians to help us maintain our academic atmosphere by ensuring that your children follow our dress code when preparing for school:

- All clothing is free of violent, racist, and immoral pictures, symbols, brands, and messages.
- Unless it is a dedicated "Spirit Day", pajama bottoms and beachwear are not permitted.
- > Indoor shoes and proper footwear are required for the gym.
- Running shoes are required if playing on the climbers.

Please note that the dress code applies to <u>all</u> students, from Kindergarten to Grade 8.

Electronic Devices

Cell phones and other electronic devices must be powered off and kept in backpacks during school hours, unless with staff consent for instructional purposes. Students will have access to the school telephone in the event of an emergency. Archbishop O'Sullivan Catholic School promotes healthy, active living. Handheld electronic games and iPods are not permitted on the school yard or in classrooms during indoor recess. Failure to comply could result in the item being confiscated and parents having to come to the school to pick up the electronic device. The school is not responsible for lost or damaged electronic devices.

Bus Safety

To maintain a high standard of safety for our students while travelling on the school bus, we ask that all parents be aware of the rules of conduct for our students. Parents can assist us immeasurably by being aware of the regulations and making sure your children

Message to Parents, Guardians Re: Procedures for Threats to School Safety

Keeping Our Students and Staff Safe

Dear Parents/Guardians:

The Algonquin and Lakeshore Catholic District School Board has a primary responsibility to ensure the safety of students and staff inside Board buildings and on Board property. In partnership with emergency services in the area, a board-wide plan has been developed to address threats to school safety. This plan includes procedures known as Evacuation, Shelter in Place, Hold and Secure, Bomb Threat/Explosive Incident, and Lockdown.

An Evacuation occurs when all students and staff are removed from the school (e.g. a fire or gas leak in the school). A Shelter in Place occurs when there is an environmental or weather related situation in the area (e.g. chemical spill). A Hold and Secure is initiated when there are circumstances in the vicinity of the school that could endanger the safety of students and/or staff (e.g. criminal event near the school but not on school property). A Bomb Threat and Explosive Incident procedures are initiated when a threat of a bomb or explosive device is received by a school either by phone or some other means (mail or social media for example). Lockdown procedures are initiated when there is a threat of violence within the school (e.g. student with a weapon). In order for all students and staff to become familiar with expectations during a threat to school safety, our school will be practicing threat response procedures as we have normally done with fire drills. In a real emergency situation, signs will be posted on the entrance doors indicating that the school has activated a Shelter in Place or Hold and Secure. The doors will be locked and no one will be allowed into the school. In a real Lockdown situation, the school will not be able to post signs and lock doors because the imminent threat is in the school building and all staff and students will be actively responding to the threat. If an Evacuation should occur, emergency services will secure the school site.

I understand that a parent or guardian would be concerned for their child during a response to a potential threat to school safety. I want to assure you that the school is prepared for any of these risks. However, if a real emergency is in effect, you will be unable to contact your child or school personnel while the situation is being resolved. If this school should activate the Threats to School Safety Procedures because of an imminent threat, the Board's Communications Officer will use all media available to update families of the situation as it unfolds. For the safety of our students and staff, two lockdown practice drills and one Bomb Threat practice will be held during the school year. The practice drills are scheduled for:

September 2018 @ 11:30 AM in the Fall

December 2018 @ 11:30 AM in the Winter

May 2019 @ 11:30 AM in the Spring.
