PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

On **Thursday, March 27th**, **380** students wrote the **Grade 10 Literacy Test at Holy Cross**. I am very confident that our students were very well prepared thanks to our **classroom teachers, Special Education Resource Teachers, the HC Literacy Committee and our EQAO Test Preparation Team** led by **Anne Poels, Ana Cantarutti, and Literacy Co-ordinator Sean Roberts**. I thank all parents for the encouragement and support they offered to their sons and daughters in the acquisition and development of their literacy skills. The **Individual Student Reports are expected by mid-June**.

Students who plan to return to Holy Cross for next year should ensure that they have completed the course selection process and have made selections based on their interests, abilities and destinations. At this time, many registrations have been received for the **Class of 2012**. Please ensure that you have completed the course selection process while space is still available. Classes do become full quickly.

Congratulations to Grade Nine student **Erik Lacharité** whose artwork was selected by the Boards' **Social Justice Committee** as the award winner for the secondary panel in the **Water Campaign Poster Contest**. **Erik** will receive his award at a Board Meeting in April. **Erik's** artwork shows that words aren't always needed when conveying the dangers of global warming.

Catholic Education Week runs from **April 27th to May 2nd** this year and the theme is "**We Are Called.**" The implications of the unique Divine call are clarified for us by the prophet Micah when he elaborates on the question of what does God require of us as a consequence of our calling. **The answer is profound and demanding in its simplicity – only this, to act justly, to love tenderly and to walk humbly with our God. (Micah 6:8)** The 'only this' is beguiling in its candour. At first glance, the challenge does not appear to be too daunting or too difficult. It is concise, understandable, and maybe even simple. Intellectually, we grasp the essential details; emotionally, we perceive the nobility of the direction and then we look for the courage and the willpower to see it through. But somewhere along the road of acting justly and loving tenderly and walking humbly, our redeemed but frail human nature wearies of the quest, and our response weakens. The beauty of being human is that even though we are very capable of making mistake after mistake, and piling stupidity upon stupidity, the Grace of a Benevolent and Forgiving God is always there to *'strengthen the limbs gone weary and the hands that are failing'* The God that calls us provides the courage and the strength to pursue the call. **(Adapted from Noel P. A list of students who are potential graduates of Holy Cross and eligible to receive their **Ontario Secondary School Diploma** and take part in the **June 2008 graduation ceremony** will be published in the **May Newsletter**. The completion of thirty (30) credits (including compulsories), forty (40) hours of Community involvement, and the successful completion of the literacy test, are the key components of the diploma requirements. The community involvement hours (40) are to be completed and submitted to Student Services by **Friday, May 16th, 2008**. It is the student's responsibility to ensure that all requirements (including night school courses and on-line courses) have been completed or will be completed. The final marks for on-line and night school courses must be submitted to Student Services by **Monday, June 16th, 2008**. Students may contact their counsellor regarding any questions concerning graduation.

University and College Acceptances

Final first semester marks have been forwarded to both OUAC and OCAS. Please be aware of the fact that universities vary widely in when they send their offers of admission. Some students may have already had an early acceptance, but this is not the norm. Mid-term marks will be forwarded to OUAC by the end of April. Grade 12 students enrolled in a night school course must have a midterm mark submitted to Student Services by **April 15th** and a final mark by **June 16th**. Universities will then begin to send offers of admission. Please reassure your son/daughter that they should not be alarmed if they do not hear at the same time as their friends. Students should expect a response from Universities by **May 26th** (latest). **May 28th** is earliest date by which Ontario universities may require a response to an offer of admission. College applicants must confirm their acceptance of a college offer by **May 1st**.

Course Selection Process

Students have had the opportunity to complete the on-line application process. Any student who has not completed the process must contact their counsellor. A verification sheet outlining course selected will be sent out this week. This is an opportunity for corrections/changes to selections to occur. Students should make a guidance appointment if they have any concerns.
