Parent/Teacher Communication:

Parents of students in Gr. JK-1 will be using the student agenda as a means of ongoing communication between school and home. Parents of students in Gr. 2-8 will have the option of using the agenda or the RemindApp as a form of communication.

If you would like to discuss daily progress or have questions about your child, please contact the teacher to set a time to meet.

School Messages:

Any changes in your child's regular bus or pick up routine should be relayed to the office either in your child's agenda or by phone as soon as possible. Ms. Robinson is in the office on Mon. Wed. and Fri. On the other days, a message may be left on the answering machine which is checked a couple of times throughout the day. Please indicate your child's name, grade, teacher and your name. If no call is received, staff will use the contact information provided to locate the child or the parent regarding the absence.

Morning Supervision

Supervision of students begins at 8:10 a.m. each morning. Parents who are dropping off their children are asked to do so after this time. Students will go directly to the playground and will enter the school at 8:25 a.m. from the playground.



Electronic Devices



Cell phones and other electronic devices must be powered off and kept in backpacks during school hours, unless with staff consent for instructional purposes. Students will have access to the school telephone in the event of an emergency. Handheld electronic games and iPods are not permitted on the school yard. The school is not responsible for lost or damaged electronic devices.

Fire Safety and School Lockdown Drills

Over the next few weeks classes will be practicing fire drills and lockdown drills.



Medication and Medical Information Forms



It is important that the school is aware if your child has a severe medical condition. School staff may only administer medication to students with written authorization from the parent/guardian **and** the prescribing physician. New forms for this school year will be sent home in the first week of school. If your child has medical needs, please contact the school to discuss these needs.



Anaphylaxis: If your child has allergies, please ensure that the medical form has been completed and returned to the office.

Transportation Safety



Parents must communicate in their child's agenda if it is necessary that the child ride a different bus. Staff will then complete the **Bus Permission Form.**

To maintain a high standard of safety for our students while travelling on the school bus, we ask that all parents be aware of the rules of conduct for our students. Parents can assist us immeasurably by being aware of the regulations and making sure your children understand and follow them. Our partners at Triboard remind us that **riding the bus is a privilege.** More information about busing may be found at www.triboard.on.ca

During the month of September, we will be practicing proper safety as it relates to busing.

PURPLE BAND PROGRAM

Junior and Senior Kindergarten students can participate in the *Purple Band Program* instituted by Tri-Board Transportation.

The Purple Equals Parents Program is a quick, safe, effective safety measure for kindergarten students. Students place a purple band on the handgrip of their backpack to let bus drivers know that someone will be at the bus stop to meet them. Additional information and purple bands will be sent home with students.

Our Catholic School Council plays an important role in our school community as they work closely with staff and parish to support our children in all aspects of their school experience.
