

School Cash Online

Our school continues to strive towards becoming a "cashless school". We are asking that parents/guardians sign up for SchoolCashOnline by simply going to the website "SchoolCashOnline" and follow the prompts. You will be able to make all payments for milk, pizza, fieldtrips, etc, online. If you do not have access to the Internet or are not set up for online banking the school will still accept cheques/cash but we ask that you do not send money with your child. Please come into the office and Mrs. Berthelot will accept payment directly from you.

Pizza and Milk

Order for pizza and milk are on schoolcash online now.

Safe Arrival Program

Parents/guardians are asked to call the school at **613-962-2162** whenever your child will be late or absent. A message may be left at any time on the answering machine. Please indicate your child's name, grade and teacher as well as your name. If no message is received, office staff will use the contact information provided to speak with the parent or guardian regarding the child's absence.

Signing In and Signing Out

A binder is in the office for parents/guardians to sign in their child when they arrive late and sign out when they pick up their child early. *Please do not take your child off the school yard.* Staff will call your child to the office to meet you.

Lunch Hour

All students are expected to stay at school throughout the lunch hour unless signed out by a parent/guardian.

<u>Changes in After School Routine</u> Any changes in your child's regular bus or pick up routine should be relayed to the office at least a day in advance when possible. If last minute changes are required, please call the school before 1:00p.m. to ensure the message gets to your child. <u>Please do not leave a message on the answering machine regarding changes in your child's end of day routine.</u>

Anaphylaxis

We have several students in our school with life threatening allergies to nuts & peanuts. Eating or touching nuts, peanuts, & food containing nuts & peanuts can result in death in a matter of minutes.

As parents, we all understand the intense concern anaphylaxis can cause. As a school community we will work together to reduce the possibility of exposure to allergens at school. Please continue to pack snack and lunch items that **do not contain nuts, peanuts, or nut products**. Should your child inadvertently bring one of these items, he/she will be asked to leave it in his/her lunch box and an alternate snack will be offered.

Medication

It is important that the school is aware if your child has a severe medical condition. School staff may only administer medication to students with written authorization from the parent/guardian <u>and</u> the prescribing physician. Please contact the school to discuss your child's medical condition and to obtain the <u>Medical Information and Consent forms</u>. All medications must be clearly labelled.
