Your Child's Digital Portfolio (Kindergarten to Grade 6)

As you are aware, regular and ongoing use of the Fresh Grade app remains our Board and school's commitment to fulfilling Ontario's Ministry of Education mandate to create pathways to success for all students. Maintaining a digital portfolio is designed to help students achieve their personal goals, and become competent, successful, and contributing members of society using an evolving and contemporary means of communication with Parents/Guardians. As part of a student centered approach to growing and learning, the goal of using digital portfolios with our students is for students to reflect on the following four areas of their learning as they design personal pathways to success:

- Knowing Yourself
- Exploring Opportunities
- Making Decisions and Setting Goals
- Achieving Goals and Making Transitions

In the coming weeks, students will begin to share some of their work and learning from class with you using the Fresh Grade app. If you have not done so already (we are using Consents signed last year), please sign the Fresh Grade Consent Form and provide your email address so that you will be notified when your child or your child's Teacher has posted work and learning to share with you. You may request a Consent from your child(ren)'s Teacher. Parents/Guardians may wish to make a supportive comment to their children, recognizing effort and accomplishments at school. Please note that while the email component is a necessary feature to make the Fresh Grade app function, Teachers may not respond by email, preferring to use the Agenda, telephone or meeting for communication with Parents/Guardians. <u>A Parent's Guide to Focusing on the</u> <u>Fundamentals of Math (Ministry of</u> <u>Education)</u>

Making sure that students have a strong understanding of the fundamentals of math is one of the best ways to prepare them for success, now and in the future. What students learn today will help best position them to solve

everyday problems and to increase their employability in tomorrow's



economy. As students progress through elementary school, they will develop their ability to think mathematically, learn about different concepts and relationships, and to apply their knowledge. Key concepts include addition, subtraction, division, and multiplication, which will help to set the stage for more advanced skills, including algebra, and working with integers and decimals, among others. By developing a strong understanding of numbers, students will be able to perform mathematical calculations quickly and accurately whether they do so mentally, on paper, or by using a calculator. The ultimate goal is for them to be able to perform mathematical procedures with ease. This skill will also support students as they develop their skills in critical thinking and problem solving. Ontario's publicly funded schools are focusing on the fundamentals of math. Please see an overview of what Ontario

Friday, November 30th is a Professional Activity Day. Staff will be engaged in activities related to the Ministry of Education's Focusing on the Fundamentals of Math initiative. As a result, there are no classes for students.

School Safety Drill

In addition to annual Fire and Lock Down Drills, all schools in ALCDSB are now required to have evacuation procedures in place in the event that a bomb threat is made to the school or to the immediate area surrounding the school. The Bomb Threat Protocol would be initiated when the safety of the school population is threatened by circumstance, the safety of the school is in jeopardy because of a threat to the surrounding area or the Board executes the steps of its Response Guide because of a local or Board implicated threat. At Our Lady of Mount Carmel Catholic School, our procedure would include classes leaving the school building through fire line procedures and meeting at Amherstview Public School or the Loyalist Recreation Centre as directed by the Emergency Response Team. Bus transportation may be arranged for accessing shelter furthest from the school. From there, Parents/Guardians would be notified by

phone, radio and/or social media to pick up their children. Each year, we are required to practice this drill. Our first Bomb Threat Protocol practice will take place on Thursday, November 29th at approximately 1:00 p.m. with our School Community Officer. Should you have any questions or concerns, please do not hesitate to contact the school.

Social Justice Update


In September, students in Grades 6, 7 and 8 were invited to create for our school a student led social justice team. Students were

Scholastic Book Fair is coming to OLMC!



<u>Kindergarten Initial Observations and</u> <u>Elementary Progress Report Cards</u> (Grades 1-8)

The Kindergarten Initial Observations Report will be sent home on Tuesday, November 6th. The purpose of this report is to provide an overview of observations of your child's learning since the start of the school year and early evidence of growth in learning in relation to the overall expectations of The Kindergarten Program (2016). As well, The Provincial Progress Report for Grades 1-8, will also be sent home on Tuesday, November 6th. The Provincial Progress Report places significant focus on the Learning Skills and Work Habits necessary for success in school and in life. The Learning Skills and Work Habits that will be assessed include:

Responsibility Collaboration Organization Initiative Independent Work Self-Regulation You will receive personalized feedback on student performance in these areas, which will serve to recognize their strengths and identify next steps which may enhance performance. Similarly, you will receive general feedback on their performance in subject areas as well. Again, the comments will recognize strengths and identify next steps for learning and achievement. Please note the traditional mark or percent will not be given on the Elementary Progress Report Card. Rather the Progress Report will tell you how well your child is progressing: "very well", "well", or "with difficulty". Parent – Teacher conferences for students in Kindergarten to Grade 8 will be held on

Wednesday, November 7^{4h} (3:45 – 5:15 p.m.) and Thursday, November 8^{th} (3:45 – 8:30 p.m.) by request. Please note that student attendance at the conference is encouraged. The Conference Request Forms will be sent home in the next couple of days. Conference times will be set as close to your request as possible. You can also expect to receive two provincial report cards, one in the winter and one at the end of the school year.

Dismissal Procedures/ Calls for Alternate Arrangements at pick up time

Again a big thank you to Parents / Caregivers who are collecting children outside their designated dismissal doors. By now, arrangements for routine dismissal are well established and going very smoothly. As mid-afternoon is a very busy time in the Office, we would ask that any alternate arrangements for Dismissal be communicated to the school well before 2:00 p.m. so that we have time to ensure messages are received by students and teachers in time for end of day.
