OLMC and the Boomerang Lunch

What is a boomerang lunch? A boomerang lunch is a lunch that has every piece of it returned to its source, home! In other words, everything in the lunch goes back home at the end of the day, including leftover food, containers, or garbage; it all goes back to be washed or disposed of at home.

We are thrilled to have a mini recycling center at our school for items such as, milk containers, juice boxes, plastics, paper/cardboard.

What can I do to ensure my child doesn't come home with a messy lunch bag? The number one choice is to send all food items in sealable reusable containers. Therefore, the only items returning in the lunch bag will be in sealed containers ready to be washed and used the next day. If you choose to send disposable containers such as yogurt, applesauce, and juice boxes, your child will be encouraged to place the empty containers in a re-sealable bag to be returned home if they cannot be recycled.

Isn't waste just being diverted home and then thrown in the garbage?

The eco-team feels that it is our responsibility to teach the students the number one best option for our environment. This is reducing waste. The purpose of the boomerang program is to promote the use of reusable containers, thus reducing the amount of lunch waste being produced by our school. The collection, transportation, and processing of garbage as well as recyclable materials require a significant amount of energy, putting strain on our environment. <u>Catholic Education Week 2019: "Living as Joyful Disciples"- May 6-10, 2019</u>

This year's Catholic Education Week theme is "Living as Joyful Disciples."

The 2019 theme was inspired by three sources: Renewing the Promise, The Pastoral Letter on Catholic Education from the Bishops of Ontario; Gaudete et exsultate, the Apostolic Exhortation of Pope Francis on the Call to Holiness; and Young People, the Faith and Vocational Discernment, the October 2018 Synod of Bishops. Mindful of the Synod on Youth, the theme and sub-themes are very much directed to the young people in our schools, especially in their growth in holiness and their formation as disciples of Christ through the discernment of their vocational pathways. In the section of *Renewing the* Promise entitled, "A Community that Forms Joyful Disciples," we read, "Our Catholic schools help to form joyful disciples as hearts and minds are opened to the transforming love of God and to the flame of faith in action. On a daily basis, Catholic schools demonstrate the joy of believing and witness the Good News to the communities that they serve."

There are five sub-themes for each day of Catholic Education Week:

In order for all students to show what they know, we ask that parents please book appointments or trips outside of these dates so as to avoid students missing part of the assessment and to ensure that all students perform to the best of their ability during the assessments. EQAO assessments are an opportunity for students to "show what they know" and to celebrate the hard work they have been doing throughout their division. <u>Kindergarten Registration and Open</u> House

We are now accepting registrations for our Kindergarten Program for September 2019. Your child is eligible to enroll in Junior Kindergarten if he or she will be 4 years of age by December 31, 2019. Please also include your child's Baptismal Certificate, Birth Certificate and Immunization Record.
