Principal's Address

Student Services

On-line Summer School 2020

The Algonquin and Lakeshore Catholic District School Board will offer online summer courses in English, Math, Co-op, and Civics/Careers (both in French and in English) from Monday, June 29th - Friday, July 24th, 2020. Other course options are available through the Ontario Curriculum Consortium, but many courses are already at capacity. Interested students should contact Mr. Poser (poser@alcdsb.on.ca) to register for a course. To discuss options for courses, reach out to either Ms. Gaudet (gaudtami@alcdsb.on.ca) or Mrs. Glancey Cox (glanceyc@alcdsb.on.ca). Parents will receive an email outlining eLearning Course Guidelines once their son/daughter is registered.

Dual Credit at St. Lawrence College

Dual credit programs are ministry-approved programs that allow high school students to take college or apprenticeship courses that count towards both the Ontario Secondary School Diploma (OSSD) and a college certificate, diploma, or an apprenticeship certification. If you are a grade 12 or fifth year student and are interested in trying out a college course before you leave high school, dual credit might be for you. For more information, email our Dual Credit teacher, Ms. Lott (Lott@alcdsb.on.ca) or connect with your guidance counsellor. Developmental Psychology, Police Foundations, Taste of the Trades, Make up, and Welding are available for fall 2020. The deadline to register students on line for fall 2020 Dual Credit courses at St. Lawrence is the end of May 2020. After that date, registrations are based on seat availability.

Next Year's Student Timetables

Timetables for next year should be available to view in Maplewood before the end of June. Once available, students should review their timetables and send an email to their guidance counsellor ASAP if changes are required. Timetable changes are limited. Please note that ALL timetables are subject to change as necessary for staffing and enrollment reasons.

A reminder that Grade 12 students planning to attend university need a minimum of six Grade 12U or M classes, including the program's prerequisites, to be considered for university.

Students need six grade twelve courses, taken at any level, to be eligible for RND's Honour Roll and Ontario Scholarship.

Counsellors availability is limited throughout the summer. They will be returning in the new school year. Please call Student Services beginning **August 26**th to book an appointment with a counsellor for the following week.

Returners

If you are considering a victory lap after graduation, you must contact either **Ms. Gaudet** or **Mrs. Glancey Cox** ASAP. You will consult on your plan for your returning year. Once complete, **Ms. Daniel** must approve your plan to return. Then you will be re-activated in Maplewood with Choices for 2020/2021.

Graduating Students

Students at risk of not graduating will receive a message via phone or email. In all cases teachers and/or Admin have connected with these households to provide additional supports for the students. If a student does not meet OSSD requirements by the end of June, they must be removed from the Grad List.

All potential graduates should click on the "Grad Survey" icon in their ALCDSB Homepage. Each year RND gathers information on our graduates through this survey. It will be used to help determine graduation awards and provides our school

with valuable insight. It will only take a few moments to complete. The deadline to submit surveys is **Friday**, **June 5**th. Each student can only submit once and will be unable to change answers after submission.

Used-Uniform Shop

Graduates are encouraged to donate their uniforms to REgiWear. This is a great way to donate back to your school and recycle your uniform. Many future and present students will benefit from your donation to the used-uniform shop. ALL funds generated from sales will help our students (ex. To buy school supplies, bursary award at graduation, food, clothing, extracurricular participation, and post-secondary applications, etc). More information to come about how to do this as the school is closed. One possible way is to combine this with dropping off textbooks and computers. It is possible the school may be open for some staff in the summer months as well.
