Principal's Address

Welcome all to the month of November. I am so pleased with the herculean efforts of students and staff thus far this fall. We have adjusted time and again and continue to keep well-being of our community at the forefront. It is so nice to hear giggles and laughter. Change Re Exam Day: Thursday, November 12th

Dear parents/guardians,

I am writing to you today to provide an update on the exam day for Octomester 2. Please note that the allotted exam day for Octomester 2 is **Thursday, November 12**th.

The following is important information for this day:

 This day will be a half day in the morning – which will be for culminating activities and will differ depending

- on the class. Some classes will participate in exam style or regular classroom activities
- Teachers, in consultation with the school administration will clearly communicate the expectations of the day to their class
- Students will be dismissed at lunch (similar to the traditional morning exam block in previous years)
- Any students who cannot secure transportation home and are in attendance for the afternoon on November 12th will be provided with a designated spot until regular dismissal
- To ensure COVID-19 protocol, students who do remain at school until regular dismissal time must remain in the designated area
- All students in the Life Skills Developmental Centres will be in attendance on November 12th, participating in their regular program

Octomester 3 will begin on **Friday, November 13th** and Octomester 4 will begin on **December 16th**. Information regarding second semester will be shared in coming weeks.

The health, safety and wellness of our students continues to remain a priority in our board. We continue to learn from our experiences during this pandemic and work diligently to ensure that our students are receiving all supports required for a successful year.

Treaty recognition week is the first week of November. A Treaty is an agreement which was made in a sacred trust between the Indigenous Peoples of Canada and the Crown. First Nations Treaties are "negotiated agreements that clearly spell out the rights, responsibilities and relationships of First Nations and the federal and provincial governments" (<u>Treaty Relations Commission Manitoba</u>). A Land acknowledgement is a stepping stone to honouring broken treaty relationships.

Regiopolis-Notre Dame Catholic High school is situated on the traditional and ancestral territories of the Anishinaabe and the Haudonesaunee. We acknowledge their enduring presence on this sacred land, as well as the presence of the Métis, Inuit, and other First Nations from across Turtle Island. Post-secondary Applications

College Applications

The application for programs starting Fall 2021, or Winter 2022, or Spring 2022 is NOW available. Students complete the online application at www.ontariocolleges.ca. The fee is \$95 for up to 5 choices (no more than 3 at any one college) – paid by Credit Card or with online banking. The deadline to apply for equal consideration is **February 1**st. Apply early to avoid disappointment. Please see your guidance counsellor if you have any questions.

Ontario University Application Centre (OUAC) PINs

This year OUAC mailed PINs directly to the home addresses of all grade 12 students at RND. Students who have yet to receive their PIN should contact their guidance counsellor immediately. If you are not applying to university this year or ever, you can shred the letter.

University Applications

Upon receipt of the OUAC PIN, students can apply to Ontario universities using the online application at www.ouac.on.ca. The base fee is \$150 for the initial <u>3</u> university/program choices. For every additional choice the fee is \$50. Some schools/programs have supplemental fees in addition to the base

fee. The deadline to apply to OUAC is **January 15th, 2021**. Apply early to avoid disappointment. Please see your guidance counsellor if you have any questions.

Major Scholarship - The Queen's Chancellor Award

Students seeking nomination for the Queen's Chancellor Award must apply to Queen's (through OUAC) before **November 20th**, **2020.** Meeting this deadline gives you early access to the Chancellor application through your SOLUS account. Link to the practice application can be found on the Regi Guidance page in your child's D2L. The completed application should be submitted through D2L on the Regi Guidance page by **Thursday**, **November 13th** to be considered for nomination. Please read the criteria noted on the Queen's website. The student who will be nominated will be notified in person by Student Services, and all other applicants will be notified via Board email. RND is only permitted **one** nomination. Again, the deadline to submit your request for nomination by RND is **November 13th**, **2020.**

Specialist High Skills Major

RND offers SHSM in Arts and Culture Sector, SHSM in Non-Profit Sector, and SHSM in Sports Sector. SHSMs are for grade 11 and 12 students who are interested in customizing their secondary school experience to suit their interests and skills.

SHSM students will:

- bundle Grade 11 and 12 credits related to the sector to connect their learning to the sector
- earn valuable industry certifications including First Aid, CPR and WHMIS, at no cost
- participate in experiential learning and career exploration activities (ex. conferences, worksite tours, and workshops)
- tour colleges and universities and workplaces in the sector
- take dual credit courses at the college
- complete the Ontario Skills Passport(OSP) during the sector-related coop placement

Dual Credit

Any grade 11 or 12 students interested in taking a Dual Credit at St. Lawrence College should contact **Ms. Lott** in Student Services. Students can participate in courses on site at SLC, but RND students also have access to congregated courses offered virtually at St. Lawrence (Kingston) and integrated courses offered virtually from all three St. Lawrence campuses.

Successful completion of the course will provide a College credit on a College transcript and a Ministry of Education credit that will go on the student's Secondary transcript. Be sure to check out Regi Guidance to learn which courses will be offered this January.

KFPL Tutoring Program

The Kingston Frontenac Public Library is pleased to announce, "In It to Win It", a virtual tutoring and homework drop-in facilitated for Kingston and Frontenac teens by Kingston and Frontenac teens.

Beginning **November 10th**, every Tuesday, from 3:30 pm to 5:00 pm, upper-year high school student volunteers will provide online tutoring to younger teens in Grades 7 and 8 as well as older teens requiring special academic support. If you have not received a copy of your IB registration form from **Mr. David**, please see him in the IB Office. Corrections must be entered by **November 6**th, **2020**.
- 2) Year 2 DP candidates are required to read the Extended Essay content pages on the Regi IB D2L page, in particular the EE Assessment Criteria. Please complete the Interim Reflection form (RPPF), and schedule your Final Reflection with your EE supervisor. A reminder that full registration for DP Exams in **May 2021** cannot proceed until the EE has been submitted to the IB Coordinator.
