
WELCOME to Mrs. MacInnis

Simply visit https://alcdsb.schoolcashonline.com/ and register to pay all school fees online. No more hunting for change for milk or pizza or trying to find a cheque to write for a school trip. It's really easy to do. Get started today!



Effective Monday, January 15th, milk and pizza orders will **ONLY be available online.** We are now a cashless school. If you registered your email address with the school on your child(ren)'s student information forms back in September, you will have now received an email from the school with the ordering information for both milk and pizza.

MILK CARDS ARE AVAILABLE at 13 milk cartons for \$10 or 26 for \$20. Milk will continue to be delivered to students on a daily basis but will only be available via milk cards and no longer available for purchase on a daily basis.

PIZZA will only be available for ordering on a monthly basis. Orders must be in by midnight on the first Tuesday of every month. After that, the option to purchase pizza will disappear from the ordering screen.

If you have any questions about how to register, simply call the school office and speak to Mrs. MacInnis for assistance.

HOLY ROSARY'S 3rd ANNUAL DANCE-A-THONIII




Information and pledge sheets will go home with all students on January 26th. All money raised will go directly to supporting our students in their curricular and extracurricular activities.

ORAL HEALTH SCHOOL SCREENING NOTIFICATION

Date of Screening: January 25th & 26th, 2018

Dental Screenings are being conducted at your child's school for:

- Students in Grades JK, SK & 2, including those with special education needs.
- Students in Grades 4, 6 & 8 may also be screened.
- Any student as requested by the child/parent.

IMPORTANT:

- Parents who do not wish to have their child screened are required to advise the school, in writing, <u>each</u> <u>school year</u> before the scheduled screening date.
- Selected students with urgent treatment needs may be rescreened at a later date.

Each child in the target group described above will receive an Oral Health School Screening Report Card.

This screening should NOT replace your child's regular visit to the dentist.

BUS SAFETY AND LOADING ZONE

To maintain a high standard of safety for our students while travelling on the school bus, we ask that all parents be aware of the school bus, we ask that all parents be aware of the

regulations and making sure your children understand and follow them. Riding the bus is a privilege. This privilege may be withdrawn if a student behaves in a manner that threatens his/her safety or the safety of others. Let's work together to protect all of our students. INFORMATION ITEMS

Students leaving early: The end of the school day is a very busy time. Lessons are wrapping up, often with vital information being imparted to complete assignments. Homework is being packed away. Reminders about the next day are being shared. Agendas are being written. It is essential that students remain for the entire instructional time until 3:10. We respectfully request that parents refrain from picking their children up "just 5 or 10 minutes early", as it disrupts teaching time, interrupts instructions in the classroom and often means students miss information they need to have. Please also understand that gathering in the office or foyer of the school to wait for children creates confusion and can be quite noisy in an area where Mrs. MacInnis is still working. For the safety of our students, we ask that adults wait outside in the parking lot until dismissal after the last recess at 3:30.

Contact Information: Please ensure your contact information and emergency contact numbers are up-to-date. In order for the 'Safe Arrival Program' to function effectively, we must be able to reach a parent/guardian if you have not called the absence in. It is also imperative that we are able to reach parents should there be an emergency.

Late Arrivals: Please be reminded that school begins each day at 9:15. We recognize that late arrivals cannot always be avoided if a student has an appointment or if there is a transportation problem, but arriving late should not be a regular occurrence. First and foremost, students arriving late are missing important instructional time in their classrooms but it also affects the other students whose learning is interrupted with each late arrival. We thank you for your efforts in ensuring your child arrives by 9:15.

CRIMINAL BACKGROUND CHECKS WITH VULNERABLE SECTOR

Believe it or not, school trips are already happening and we are always in need of volunteers to accompany us. In order for adults (including grandparents) to volunteer on school trips or within the school, we must have an <u>original</u> Criminal Background Check with Vulnerable Sector on file at the school. The school will provide you with a letter to obtain this check. There is a fee associated with getting a check from the Belleville Police Services or Picton OPP.




PEDICULOSIS (HEAD LICE)

Parents are asked to frequently check their child's head for pediculosis. We are appreciative of the parent calls to the school informing us of any findings of head lice. Should your child have head lice, you will be notified by school personnel and asked to treat

your child's hair. The child may return to school the next day if there is no evidence of nits. Information about how to remove them is available from your family doctor, board website, health unit and most pharmacies. Letters to parents will be sent home if head lice are present in their child's classroom so that they can keep a close eye out. Please remember that head lice are a social nuisance and not a health hazard. However, they are very difficult to get rid of and your cooperation in notifying us is greatly appreciated.

HEALTHY AND ACTIVE SCHOOLS

Holy Rosary school staff are diligent about protecting student health and safety by reminding parents to refrain from sending in food such as cupcakes or candy for school



celebrations, including birthdays and special holidays. Parents may want to acknowledge their child's special day with themed pencils or stickers. This also allows parents of students with severe allergies to rest at ease, knowing that food that could possibly contain allergens won't be consumed by their child. The Ministry of Education's School Food and Beverage Policy (PPM 150) is a step in creating healthier schools. Educating students

and parents about healthy eating will also translate into healthier citizens, contributing to a reduction in chronic diseases such as heart disease, type 2 diabetes, and certain types of cancers. Please note that any treats sent to school for sharing that do not meet the standards of PPM 150 will be returned home. Thank you for your cooperation in helping us help your children become healthy, active, and contributing citizens.


Math Homework Help
