## Safe Entry Procedures

**At Sacred Heart Catholic School we endeavour to be a safe and welcoming environment for all of our students, staff and families. We have a safe entry system that is in operation from 9am until 3:30pm each day to ensure that all visitors who come to the school check in at the office and be screened appropriately. We do from time to time have members of the community who enter the school before or after hours and do not check in at the office. The office must be your first stop every time you enter the school, and the secretary or Principal will make a call to the teacher you wish to see, before heading to their classrooms. Teachers, EA's and school staff could be meeting with other parents, each other, or on the phone discussing confidential information and it could be embarrassing for any of the parties should this information be overheard. Thank you for your cooperation with this matter, as we try to ensure the safety and confidentiality of all of our students, staff and families.**


### Safe Arrival Program

Numeracy Quick Tip:# 3

Use real world examples to teach math. Point out ways that people use math every day to pay bills, balance their checkbooks, figure out their net earnings, make change, and tip at restaurants. Involve older children in projects that incorporate geometric and algebraic concepts like planting a garden, building a bookshelf, or figuring how long it will take to drive to your family vacation destination .

Literacy Quick Tip:# 3

Surround your child with reading material

Many children will read everything they see around them, so the more they see, the better. Keep books and magazines readily available, of course, but also think outside the box. For example, rather than putting the breakfast cereal away as soon as you've poured it, why not set it in front of them on the table and let them read the back panel? To help very early readers, put name labels on doors, windows, pieces of furniture to help them learn everyday words.

## Sacred Heart Skiing

## Inclement Weather and Bus Cancellations

The winter months are upon us. During this cold time of year parents and guardians should be aware of how to determine if their child's bus has been canceled. Please note that the decision to cancel busses rests with Tri-Board Bussing services. Bus routes cancelled due to inclement weather are cancelled for the entire day. **If you choose to bring your child to school please note that you will be required to pick them up at the end of the day.** In order to access information regarding bus cancellations please visit [www.triboard.on.ca](http://www.triboard.on.ca) On this site you will be able to determine if your child's bus is running, delayed or canceled. In the last few years we have seen our schools close formally only twice. Bus cancellations do not mean that schools will be closed. The decision to close schools can only be made by the Director of Education. If schools are closed however, we will make every effort to send out a Synervoice message to your homes letting you know that Sacred Heart has been closed for the day. In the event that the schools are closed part way through the day, again a Synervoice will be sent out, and in the event parents can not be reached we will call Emergency Contacts. Please call Mrs. Shangraw to ensure that you Emergency Contact information is up to date.
