

Students First – Excellence for All

The purpose of Students First – Excellence for All is to ensure that the right people, resources and supports are in place in a decentralized model of operations that will lead to improved student learning. Families of schools called Learning Networks provide numerous teacher and student resources to support both literacy and numeracy instruction. Professional Learning Communities are in evidence both in schools and across Learning Network Communities and at the Board Office where educators come together to focus on student learning.

Technology

Our Board has established a unique partnership with provincial schools to support growth in technological education for our students. A state-of-the-art technological facility has been developed at the Sir James Whitney School for the Deaf (SJW) in Belleville. ALCDSB teachers deliver two credit programs at the SJW site in construction, transportation, manufacturing and hairstyling. Our secondary students from Belleville and Trenton Catholic schools and SJW students can take advantage of these new opportunities, enabling them to establish their career pathway in technology or satisfy their personal interests.

Apprenticeship Programs

The Ontario Youth Apprenticeship Program (OYAP) opens the door to apprenticeships in a wide range of exciting careers. Students in our Board can work towards a career in a skilled trade as a registered apprentice, and eventually a certified skilled worker or journeyman, while completing an Ontario Secondary School Diploma. OYAP helps young people obtain placements in 130 skilled trades that can be learned through apprenticeship training. Students register as apprentices and begin their formal apprenticeship training while still in school. With both a diploma and the skills to get the job done when they graduate, these students have a head start on their futures.

- The jurisdiction of the Board covers approximately 16,134 square kilometers from Seeley's Bay in the east to Trenton in the west to Whitney in the north to Picton in the south.
- The system employs over 1,900 full-time, part-time and occasional teachers and support staff.
- Our 2006-2007 budget was set at \$114.3 million.
- The Board continues to make Special Education a high priority and will spend approximately \$12.8 million in 2006-07 to support our special needs students.
- We have one principal and five teachers delivering the Ontario curriculum at two school sites in the People's Republic of China.
