UNIVERSAL PRECAUTIONS RE BLOOD AND BODILY FLUIDS

- 1. Use impermeable gloves if blood or bodily fluids containing visible blood are anticipated.
- 2. Stop the bleeding, cover the wound and change the uniform if contaminated with excessive amounts of blood.
- 3. Wash hands and skin after contact with blood.
- 4. Clean any surfaces or equipment with appropriate disinfectant and clean clothes or skin with soap and water or an appropriate antiseptic.
- 5. Use proper disposal procedures for contaminated clothing and equipment.
- 6. Use a ventilation device for emergency resuscitation.
- 7. Avoid direct contact patient care if you have an open skin condition.
- 8. Follow accepted guidelines for control of bleeding and for any body fluids containing visible blood.
- 9. Encourage all participants to use individual water bottles.
