Each family is asked to ensure that we have a LOCAL emergency contact name if we cannot reach you.

Administration of Medication/Epi Pen

Student permission forms must be submitted every school year. Medication, where applicable, must be brought to the school, with the doctor's forms, and kept at the office.

Epipens – for safety of students, epipens must be either on the student or kept at the office; for safety reasons backpacks are not appropriate.

Please inform the office and your child's teacher of the location of the epipen.

ANAPHYLAXIS (ALCDSB Policy Statement: Anaphylaxis) Procedures Risk Reduction – Roles and Responsibilities Parent/Guardian (or Student where appropriate) Provide a letter from the physician, diagnosing the allergy and its severity. Complete the required ALCDSB forms Medical Information (Form B) and Administration of Medication EpiPen Injection (Form A). It is recommended that parents/guardians provide two auto-injector EpiPens; one to be kept with the student at all times, the second to be stored at the school according to the Emergency Plan. Renew EpiPens before the expiry date. Provide fanny pack/backpack for transport of EpiPen with student. It is recommended that a laminated card with important information be carried in the fanny pack with the EpiPens (Form D). Be sure your son/daughter wears a Medic-Alert bracelet. Help your son/daughter develop coping skills to avoid the allergen and recognize and communicate the symptoms to an adult.

Important Medical Information

CLARIFICATION AND COMPASSION: An increasing number of students and staff members within our school community have <u>severe and life-threatening allergies</u> to <u>PEANUTS & PEANUT OIL</u>. As parents, we all understand the intense concern that this can cause and as a school community we will work to reduce the possibility of this exposure at school. As we share many common areas in our school such as the gym, the yard equipment, bathroom facilities and the library, <u>WE ARE EXPECTING THAT ALL PARENTS WILL REFRAIN FROM SENDING PEANUTS, PEANUT BUTTER AND PRODUCTS KNOWN TO CONTAIN PEANUT OIL TO SCHOOL FOR LUNCHES, DAILY SNACKS OR SHARED CELEBRATION SNACKS.</u>

The joint effort that we will all make in this area relates directly to the health and wellbeing of others and is an appropriate common initiative. SOME ADDITIONAL ALLERGIES WITHIN INDIVIDUAL CLASSROOMS WILL ALSO BE COMMUNICATED TO YOU AS NEED BE.

PLEASE LET US KNOW---Parents of students who have medication needs at school are asked to let us know immediately and to ensure that they have completed a medication consent form with their family doctor FOR THIS SCHOOL YEAR. This must be completed by family doctors before we are able to administer medication.

<u>All Parents Note</u>: It is important for parents to be aware that at no time can medication be casually sent to school with students. Students are not to self-administer medication nor to store it nor can short term pain remedies or antibiotics be administered at school without the above mentioned documentation. Please call if you have questions or need information.

Additional Allergy Information

Being a nut-free school, we strive not only to provide products that are nut-free but also an atmosphere that ensures our students feel safe and secure at school, especially our students who have life-threatening allergies to nut products. Recently, certain products that are made from soy products have been directing advertising campaigns to school communities, with the intent being to market their products as safe and viable options for school lunches. While these products are certainly nut-free, they do however, resemble peanut butter so closely that it is virtually impossible to distinguish between a peanut butter sandwich and a sandwich made from a 'nut-free' alternative. As children with allergies are highly sensitive to what is being eaten around them, we feel, as a school community, that the presence of these products may possibly create unnecessary anxiety.

We appreciate, as always, parents' concern for the safety and well-being of all children in the school. For more information on providing healthy lunches, with nut-free alternatives, please contact the local health unit, or visit the Health Unit's website at www.hpechu.on.ca

Safe Welcome System

Our School is equipped with a Safe Welcome System School Doors and Gates will be locked at 9:15 am. Guests to the School will have to be buzzed in by a staff member to gain entry. This safe welcome system will provide increased safety in our schools by ensuring all visitors use the same entry doors and sign in.

Periodically throughout the day staff may be attending to other duties and may not be readily available to answer the buzzer, please be patient as you wait until someone returns to the main office. If you are picking up your child prior to the end of the day (Prior to 3:15) you will need to sign them out at the office, once you arrive we will call the classroom and have the student meet you in the main office.

If you are picking your child up at the end of the day (After 3:15) we respectfully ask you to wait outside the school gate until the end of the day bell rings. Students who are walkers and picked up by parents will exit through the parking lot gate.

School Agendas

All of our students from grades 1-8 are provided with an Agenda Book as a means of fostering and developing organizational skills. If parents wish to make a donation to defer the costs, we suggest \$5.00, due by September 15th. Students are expected to record important events, projects, test dates and homework assignments. We ask that you the Parents also use them as a convenient communication tool between home and school. Teachers will check agendas daily in order to ensure a ready link with all students and their parents. Sensitive information should not be written in agendas.

Electronic Devices

Please read the school code of conduct in the front of the agenda regarding electronic devices. We would ask that all parents sign this code of conduct. All cell phones and electronic devices are to be powered off and put away once students are on school property. Some pilot projects continue to run in our junior/intermediate classrooms where students use electronic devices under direct teacher supervision to enhance learning. Feedback from this project is continually gathered.

School Cash Online

The Algonquin and Lakeshore Catholic District School Board is offering School Cash Online as its preferred method of payment for all school fees, everything from field trips to yearbooks.

School Cash Online allows parents to pay school related fees safely, quickly and easily. By using School Cash Online, you help increase efficiency and security at schools. Teachers and secretaries are then able to focus on helping students, and not counting cash.

School Cash Online shows all of the school fees available to your student online for purchase. You can also stay informed of upcoming events and keep track of which school fees require your attention.

DAILY ROUTINES: Timetable

MORNING

Please note that supervision in the yard will be provided beginning at 9:00am. For their safe arrival, please do not have your child come to school before 9:00am. Buses should arrive between 9:00 and 9:15am. Students may proceed directly to the yard.

LUNCH

Lunch hour is from 12:20 to 1:20. Students will eat their lunch in supervised classrooms from 12:20 to 12:40 and be outside for the remaining 40 minutes. As in the past, no food is to be taken on the yard during the lunch hour.

Students are NOT permitted to leave the school for lunch. As is common practice with other Catholic schools in our Board, please note, only students who regularly go home for lunch to eat with adult supervision OR who can be picked up by their parents are allowed to leave the school for lunch. Parents please indicate, at the beginning of the school year, to the classroom teacher whether the student will be leaving school to eat lunch at home. We are concerned for their safety and it is jeopardized if they leave the school property. Thank you for supporting us in taking safety measures for our students.

Parking Lot Reminders

Parent Parking

There is no entry or parking in the newly constructed Bus Loop, this will allow a free and clear area for Emergency Vehicles and Busses. Parent Parking will be located in the previous Bus Parking Lot on the West Side of the School. For the next few weeks during final completion, onsite parking will be extremely limited.

Parking Lot Entry/ Exit

As a result of the new Bus Loop we will have one Exit from the school grounds for Busses and Vehicles, this will be located in the middle of the two entry points (same as previous) Parent parking lot entry will be the entrance the furthest west of the school property.

Students being Picked up / Walkers

All Students that are being picked up by parents or walking home will Exit the school grounds at the West Gate closest to the Primary Yard.

Walkers will proceed toward the front of the school and cross at the painted crossing zone to the sidewalk.

Bussed Students

All Bused students will exit the school grounds at the East Gate closest to the New Bus loop, and will proceed down the sidewalk to the appropriate Bus.

Last Minute Changes to Routines

If there are to be changes to routines for going home (e.g. someone new picking up your child, child not taking the bus as usual), please provide a note in the agenda for the teacher indicating this change. If the need for change occurs after your child is already at school, please notify the office as soon as possible. If you need to pick up your child from school during the day for appointments etc., and happen to arrive during recess or noon hour, *please do not go directly to the yard. Sign in at the office so we can contact the yard supervisor to send your child in.* If someone other than yourself is picking up your child, please indicate this in your note and please explain our school's routine to this person.

Safe Arrival Procedures

Please contact the school office prior to the absence of your child, stating the reason for the absence. This notification is to ensure the safety of pupils while en route to the school. If the school is not made aware of your child's absence the office will contact you. For your convenience, a telephone answering machine is on from 4:15 p.m. thru 8:15 a.m. Please continue to send a note to the classroom teacher. Thank you for your assistance in ensuring the safe arrival of your children.

Volunteering in Schools

All parents, grandparents, and community volunteers who wish to participate in any activity at school such as going on field trips, volunteering in the library or for a classroom teacher, working in the breakfast club, or volunteering to assist as a temporary or full School Council Member will be required to have a police check completed and presented to the school in its original format. We so encourage and value your participation that we would like to facilitate this for you as best we can. We can provide a cover letter to your local police detachment that usually results in the check being done at no cost to you. We appreciate your understanding and support. This process is good for three years once completed. Please contact your local Police Station to inquire about their process for application.


