A...Ask them gently


L...Listen Attentively

Congratulations to the Holy Cross Field Hockey team for winning the 2017 KASSAA Championship! On Tuesday, October 24th, HC earned their ticket to the KASSAA finals, beating Regiopolis Notre Dame 4 - 0 in semi-final action. On Wednesday, October 25th, HC beat Bayridge Secondary School 3 - 2 in a nail-biting KASSAA final championship game. The Crusader's first goal was scored early in the game by grade 11 student Alle Arsenault. A second Holy Cross goal was scored by grade 12 student Kaeli McDonald. A 2 - 2 tie in the fading minutes of the contest was broken by a goal in the last 5 seconds of the game by Alle Arsenault. This is a back-to-back repeat championship win for Holy Cross, winning the 2016 and now the 2017 KASSAA Field Hockey title! The Crusaders now advance to OF-SAA finals November 2nd to 5th in Burlington. Well done ladies! Holy Cross is proud of your hard earned accomplishment!
