## Counsellor's Corner

### **ASPEN Student portal – course selection for 2021/22 school year**

Students can view their timetable, credit accumulation and course requests for next year on the Aspen student portal found on students' virtual commons. Students should review the courses they have chosen for next year on the 'my info' tab found at the top of the home page. Click on 'current schedule' and then click on the 'requests' tab found on the left. Students should contact their guidance counsellors if they would like to make changes to their course selections for next year. Grade 12 students interested in returning next year should contact their guidance counsellor.

### **OUAC and OCAS**

Marks have been submitted to OUAC and OCAS. Students should check their account to make sure all information is accurate. Students must accept offers of admission in their OUAC and OCAS accounts, and they must do so by the published deadline dates provided by the post-secondary institutions.

### **Community Service Requirement for Graduates**

For the 2020-21 school year, the Ministry of Education has revised the 40-hour community involvement graduation requirement so that students will not be adversely impacted by the ongoing challenges related to COVID-19. For students graduating in the 2020-21 school year, the community involvement graduation requirement will be reduced to a minimum of **20 hours** of community involvement activities. This recognizes that graduating students have had barriers to earning their community involvement hours last school year and there may be continued barriers this school year.

Students can include activities that are performed at home and for family members. Graduating students should submit their volunteer hours by May 31st to ensure the community service graduation requirement is met.

## Ontario Secondary School Literacy Test (OSSLT) Update

We would like to provide an update to parents/guardians and students regarding the Ontario Secondary School Literacy Test (OSSLT) administered by the Education Quality and Accountability Office (EQAO). The OSSLT is a graduation requirement for secondary students in Ontario and is typically written by students in Grade 10. Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, the OSSLT was not administered last school year and the literacy test requirement was waived for students graduating in 2021.

This year, the EQAO is field testing a new online OSSLT. Participation in this field test is not mandatory and as a result of the government's directive that all schools in Ontario move to remote learning following the April break, **ALCDSB has decided not to participate**. This means that eligible students will write the OSSLT during the 2021-22 school year. This decision not to participate in the field test was made with the best interests of students and families in mind and is consistent with a number of other school boards in Ontario.

Because the EQAO requires the OSSLT field test to be completed in-person, our students currently would not be able to access this opportunity virtually. Nor have we received any information at this time regarding a potential return to in-person learning. Moreover, we are focused on supporting the mental health and well-being of students and families. During what has been a challenging and stressful year for many, we do not believe it would be reasonable to add another item to students' plates.

We feel strongly that this is the best decision for students at present. Looking forward to next year, the EQAO has plans underway to provide multiple sittings of the OSSLT to ensure that all students can fulfill their graduation requirement. Further details on plans for next year will be shared with our school community once EQAO has provided this information to school boards.

Thank you for your ongoing understanding and support.

Loyalist Township is once again organizing some events for National Youth Week (May 1-7). This year we're running 4 virtual events.


