

The University Application Process 2020-2021

Late October	Students receive Application Access Code Letter at HC in Student Services. This includes the school number, student number and a temporary PIN. Students will then be able to create an OUAC account on www.ouac.on.ca in the undergraduate 101 file.
November 20, 2020	Deadline date for OUAC to receive all first semester midterm/interim grades for grade 12 U/M courses. (This is a new addition to the process)
December 15, 2020	Recommended date for completion of online application (students are encouraged to have their application ready to submit by this date)
January 15, 2021	Deadline date for Ontario High School students to submit their online application to the OUAC. Applications received after this date will still be processed by the OUAC and distributed to the universities. However, specific university deadlines will apply. The application will include all final grades from completed grade 11 and 12 courses and a list of all current year courses in progress.
February 11, 2021	Deadline for Ontario secondary schools to report final grades for first-semester courses to OUAC
April 22, 2021	Deadline for Ontario secondary schools to report midterm/interim grades for second-semester courses to OUAC
May 27, 2021	The latest date by which all secondary school applicants shall expect a response from an Ontario university. Such a response will be one of: 1) an offer of admission; 2) a refusal; or 3) a deferral pending the receipt of specific additional information
June 1, 2021	The earliest date an Ontario High School student may be required to respond to an offer of admission, and give a financial commitment

July 6, 2021

Deadline for Ontario high schools to report final grades and proof of graduation.

The application is submitted online to the Ontario University Application Centre (OUAC). The application fee is \$150 for three university program choices. An additional \$50 will be charged for each university program choice beyond the initial three, as well as any changes made to choices. (Fees may change – prices are based on last year's application).

Students are required to have 6 grade 12 courses at the U or M (U/C) code to be eligible for university programs. Coop credits are not eligible for university admission.

Please note:

Ontario Scholar Eligibility – Grade 12 students will be considered Ontario Scholars if they achieve an 80% average from **any 6 grade 12 courses. Grade 11 courses taken in grade 12 will not be included in the calculation.** The Ontario Scholar certificate will be presented at the graduation ceremony.
