Cancelled Buses

The decision to remove buses from the road because of unsafe driving conditions is made by Tri-Board Student Transportation. Late busses and cancellations are announced by our local radio stations and are listed at www.triboard.on.ca

Buses that are cancelled due to snow are cancelled for the whole day. Parents who drive their child(ren) to school on a "snow day" are responsible for picking them up at the end of the school day. Buses that are cancelled in the morning due to fog will run in the afternoon.

There is always the possibility of bus cancellations during the school day. Parents are reminded to update all phone numbers as well as emergency contact information.
