The Ontario Schools Battery Recycling Challenge Is Back And We Want **Your Used Batteries!**

Please send in your used household batteries to St. Joseph Catholic School! We are one of 200 schools across Ontario competing in the Ontario Schools Battery Recycling Challenge. The Challenge officially launches on October 21, 2019 (Waste Reduction Week) and runs until April 22, 2020 (Earth Day). Its purpose is to teach children and their families

about the proper way to handle, store and recycle batteries at home and at school. We won't just be collecting batteries to help our environment and to try to win money - we will also be helping to raise funds for the SickKids Foundation. Our challenge is to raise at least an entire household's worth for every student and staff member enrolled. We need an average of 1.5 kilograms recycled for each participant. That's a total of 600 kg! **Please help** us meet that goal by sending us your used batteries.


