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Safe Arrival Program

Parents/guardians are asked to call the school at **613-962-3653** whenever your child will be late or absent. A message may be left at any time on the answering machine. Please indicate your child's name, grade and teacher as well as your name. If no message is received, office staff will use the contact information provided to speak with the parent or guardian regarding the child's absence.



Signing In and Signing Out

A clipboard is in the office for parents/guardians to sign in their child when they arrive late and sign out when they pick up their child early. *Please do not take your child off the schoolyard*. Staff will call your child to the office to meet you.



Lunch Hour

Please notify the school in writing if your child will be walking home for lunch every day. All students are expected to stay at school throughout the lunch hour unless signed out by a parent/guardian.



Changes in After School Routine

Any changes in your child's regular bus or pick up routine should be relayed to the office at least a day in advance when possible. If last minute changes are required, please call the school before 1:00p.m. to ensure the message gets to your child. *Please do not leave a message*

on the answering machine regarding changes in your child's end of day routine.

Working Together for School Safety

The safety of our students is a priority. In order to maintain a safe environment for our children, staff will address all unidentified adults. While no parent/guardian considers themselves a stranger to our school, many children will not know your identity and will point you out as a stranger.

Parents/guardians can help us keep all of our children safe by following these practices:

- -Staff are on duty before and after school to meet the buses and supervise the yard. Please do not leave your child in the yard before supervision begins or take your child from the school yard during recesses.
- -All parents/guardians, visitors, and non-school personnel are required to enter the school by the main doors and come directly to the main office to sign in. Office staff will happily assist you.
- -Unauthorized parents/guardians and visitors are not permitted in the hallways or the schoolyard during school hours.
- -Teachers will gladly meet with parents/guardians during set times. Conversations during class time or when teachers are on supervision prevent our staff from giving our students their full attention.
- -Parents who drive their children to and from school can **park in the parking lot on Herchimer Street** and walk their child to the gate. There are many cars during drop off and pick up times. Please do not have your child run across the parking lot alone.

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September Focus Virtue: FAITH

Our school community continues to affirm our Catholic identity through daily prayers, school Masses and liturgies, social justice outreach, and curriculum connections. The Catholic virtues, such as faith, love, and temperance, guide us as we strive to be disciples of Jesus in our daily lives.

Anaphylaxis

We have several students in our school with life threatening allergies to nuts & peanuts. Eating or touching nuts, peanuts, & food containing nuts & peanuts can result in death in a matter of minutes.

As parents, we all understand the intense concern anaphylaxis can cause. As a school community we will work together to reduce the possibility of exposure to allergens at school. Please continue to pack snack and lunch items that **do not contain nuts**, **peanuts**, **or nut & peanut products**. Should your child inadvertently bring one of these items, he/she will be asked to leave it in his/her lunch box and an alternate snack will be offered.



Medication

It is important that the school is aware if your child has a severe medical condition. School staff may only administer medication to students with written authorization from the parent/guardian **and** the prescribing physician. Please contact the school to discuss your child's medical condition

and to obtain the **Medical Information and Consent forms**. All medications must be clearly labelled.



Automated Messaging

St. Joseph Catholic School uses an automated notification service to communicate important messages to our families. We require updated phone information in order for this system to work to its full potential. Please inform us of which **phone number you would like to receive automated messages** by filling out your child(ren)'s orange Student Information Form.



Student Agendas

Agendas are excellent tools by which students in grades 1-8 develop their organizational skills. They also provide an avenue for ongoing communication between home and school. Important information, such as positive school climate & well-being, can be found at the front of our agenda.

Appropriate Dress

Students are expected to be dressed in a modest and respectful manner that reflects our Catholic values and forms a mindset for learning. We ask parents/guardians to help us maintain our academic atmosphere by ensuring that your children respect our dress code when preparing for school:

- Chest, midriffs, and backs are covered.
- Undergarments, including bra straps, should not be exposed.
- Shorts, skirts, and dresses are to be of an appropriate fit and length for an academic setting.
- All clothing is free of violent, racist, and immoral pictures, symbols, brands, and messages.
- Unless it is a dedicated "Spirit Day", pajama bottoms and beachwear are not permitted.
- Indoor shoes and proper footwear for gym and the yard are needed for safety reasons.

Electronic Devices

Phones and other personal electronic devices must be powered off and kept in backpacks during school hours. These items are not necessary for learning as classes are fitted with iPads and laptops. Students will have access to the school phone in the event of an emergency. Grade 7 & 8 teachers will let parents know when students are invited to use their phones as classroom tools.

St. Joseph Catholic School promotes healthy, active living. Phones, handheld electronic games, iPods, etc. are not permitted on the schoolyard or in classrooms during indoor recess. Failure to comply could result in the item being confiscated and parents having to come to the school to pick up the electronic device.
