

Health Notice

We have been made aware of the presence of pink eve (conjunctivitis) in our school community. Anyone can get pink eye, but preschoolers, schoolchildren, teachers and daycare workers are particularly at risk for the contagious types of pink eye because they work closely with others in the classroom. There are various causes for pink eye and in most cases it is caused by: infections caused by viruses or bacteria; dry eyes from lack of tears or exposure to wind and sun; chemicals, fumes or smoke; and/or allergies. The viral and bacterial pinkeye are very contagious and very easily spread (most commonly due to improper hand washing). If your child has red, itchy eyes that are weeping or crusty in the morning it is best to see your doctor. Medication can be prescribed that allows your child's eyes to be treated and then he/she can return to school. Please know that we continue to be vigilant about the cleaning of surfaces and items shared by children but your attention to this is also greatly appreciated to help decrease the spread of the infection.
