

**PEDICULOSIS (HEAD LICE) CONTROL:** Spring and fall are the seasons when **HEAD LICE** commonly infest school children. Head lice feed on blood and cement their eggs, commonly called nits, to strands of hair at the scalp. The nits take approximately 7-10 days to hatch. The bite of a louse causes itching which can be aggravated and infected by scratching. <u>Please check your child's head on a regular basis</u>. If you find evidence of head lice or nits, information about how to remove them is available from your **family doctor, health unit** and **most pharmacies**. Our trained volunteers will be conducting pediculosis checks periodically throughout the school year.
