Student Services

Reminder for Students Applying to University

The deadline for Ontario secondary school students to submit completed online applications to OUAC (Ontario University Application Centre) is **January 13th, 2022**. Because of the high volume of applications received prior to this date, RND students are strongly encouraged to complete their application prior to the Christmas Holidays.

Students are encouraged to make an appointment with their guidance counsellor if they need any further assistance with their application. Students should have picked up OUAC PINs from Student Services at this point in time, but it is not too late. This PIN is needed to apply.

Students applying to out-of-province universities must email Mrs. Lackey (<u>tlackey@alcdsb.on.ca</u>) as soon as possible to determine if a transcript must be sent or if the school in question is an OUAC-partner. Early notification will ensure deadlines for transcripts can by met.

Reminder for Students Applying to College

Applications received and paid for on or before **February 1**st, **2022** will be given equal consideration by the colleges. Because of the high volume of applications received each year, RND students are strongly encouraged to complete their application prior to the Christmas Holidays. After **February 1**st, **2022**, applications are still processed but will be considered by the colleges on a first-come, first-served basis. It is unlikely that an

application for a highly competitive program will be considered after the deadline.

Students are encouraged to make an appointment with their guidance counsellor if they need any further assistance with their application.

OUAC and OCAS – Educational Information

It is the responsibility of all applicants to ensure the educational information uploaded from our records to OUAC and/or OCAS is accurate. The most recent OUAC and OCAS uploads occurred on **November 19th**. Students should be checking their accounts regularly and should notify Student Services if any errors are noticed.

Regi Guidance in D2L

Several grade 12s are missing important announcements and reminders because they are not checking Regi Guidance on a regular basis. The page can be found in the student D2L classes. Student announcements also contain reminders to check new information in D2L. All students need to check daily.

Quadmester Three and Four Co-op Students

Any student in grade 11 or 12 who has co-op in quadmester 3 or 4 should be searching for an appropriate co-op placement with the help of family and friends. If you have any questions, please contact **Mr. Farrell or Mr. McDonald** in Student Services.

St. Lawrence College Winter 2022 Dual Credit applications are now open. Equal consideration deadline will be **December 8th**, **2021**.

Registrants from non-partner schools must complete registration materials by **Friday, January 28th**, 2022.

Tutoring at RND

Pathways to Education

Pathways to Education is a free, community-based program providing high school youth with -

- Tutoring all subjects
- Mentoring Includes workshops, field trips, YMCA memberships, and volunteer opportunities
- Financial Support incentives include PC Gift cards, school lunch vouchers, and a post-secondary scholarship up to \$2000 (after four years)
- Other Support each student is assigned a student/parent support worker
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Pathways is open to any high school students who live in the area of Division Street, Raglan Road, Conacher Drive, and the Inner Harbour area. Meetings between Student Support Workers and RND students in the Pathways program began in early October.
