Student Services

Post Secondary Information Session

On **Wednesday, September 30**th, Student Services shared a presentation via the RND YouTube channel to inform all grade 12 students on the post-secondary application process. Students who have a spare in octomester 1 and remote learners should view the presentation as soon as possible. It is still active and parents/guardians are encouraged to view the presentation as well.

University and College Presentations

Although this is an unusual year for post-secondary visits, most schools will provide virtual campus tours as well as online liaison sessions. The schedule that outlines what the schools will offer this year is on the RND Guidance page in D2L. Ask your child to share this document with you.

College Applications

The application for programs starting Fall 2021 or Winter 2022 or Spring 2022 will be available in early October 2020. All applications are online. Students access the application at www.ontariocolleges.ca. The fee is \$95 for up to 5 choices (no more than 3 at any one College) – and must be paid in order to submit the complete application. The deadline to apply for equal consideration is **February 1**st, **2021**. Students should apply early to avoid disappointment. Also, students should make an appointment to see their guidance counsellor if they have any questions.

University Applications

The application for Fall 2021 will be available in October 2020. Students require a PIN issued from the Ontario University Application Centre (OUAC); these PINs will be mailed directly to students' homes. All applications are online. Students access the application at www.ouac.on.ca. The base application fee is \$150 for the initial 3 university/program choices. Each additional choice costs \$50. In some cases there are supplemental fees — as noted on the OUAC website. The deadline to apply to OUAC is **January 15th**, **2021**. Students should apply early to avoid disappointment — preferably before

Christmas Break – and should see their guidance counsellor if they have any questions.

Tutoring Options

Student Services has a limited number of private tutors who offer one-on-one tutoring for a fee; the fee is generally about \$20.00 to \$30.00 per session. Parents or students should contact Guidance for more information.

Queen's students (Helping Young People Excel) will soon be available to assist with all level courses through online tutoring. Details to follow.

Pathways to Education

Pathways to Education is a free, community-based program providing high school youth with -

- Tutoring all subjects
- Mentoring Includes workshops, field trips, YMCA memberships, and volunteer opportunities
- Financial Support incentives include PC Gift cards, school lunch vouchers, and a post-secondary scholarship up to \$2000 (after four years)
- Other Support each student is assigned a student/parent support worker

Pathways is open to any high school students who live in the area of Division Street, Raglan Road, Conacher Drive, and the Inner Harbour area.

Student Support Workers will begin meeting with RND students on their caseload over the next couple of weeks.

RND offers SHSM in Arts and Culture Sector, SHSM in Non-Profit Sector, and SHSM in Sports Sector. SHSMs are for grade 11 and 12 students who are interested in customizing their secondary school experience to suit their interests and skills.

SHSM students have the opportunity to:

- bundle Grade 11 and 12 credits related to the sector to connect their learning to the sector
- earn valuable industry certifications including First Aid, CPR and WHMIS, at no cost
- participate in experiential learning and career exploration activities (ex. conferences, worksite tours, and workshops)
- tour colleges and universities and workplaces in the sector
- take dual credit courses at the college

• complete the Ontario Skills Passport(OSP) during the sector-related coop placement

Dual Credit

Any students interested in enrolling in the Dual Credit program at Regiopolis-Notre Dame Catholic High School should contact **Ms. Lott** in the Student Services Department. Applications for winter 2020/21 are now available. Students should apply early to avoid disappointment. Applications close in early November. Participating students must be in Grade 11 or 12 or returning for a fifth year.

The Dual Credit program affords students the opportunity to take a college course free of charge. **Ms. Lott** provides academic support to students while they are taking Dual Credits. Successful completion of the course will provide a college credit on a college transcript and a Ministry of Education credit that will go on the student's high school transcript.
