PLEASE DO NOT WALK THROUGH THE DRIVEWAY

We have asked repeatedly for parents not to drop off their children in the staff driveway and not to walk through the driveway with their children. **This is a very dangerous situation** and we have had many incidents where rushing parents have not seen families and almost hit them. We are going to go back to closing the parking lot in the mornings and at night and ask that when you are dropping off your children use the walkway with the footprints beside the parking lot. It is important that we model responsible habits for our children. Parents are asked to be respectful with staff when they direct them to park in the appropriate areas and to model our Code of Conduct for their children.

We will be writing EQAO during the last two weeks of May. We have asked parents of grade 3 and grade 6 students to not book trips, appointments, hockey practices and other appointments that will prevent their child from being at school. It is the expectation that all students in those grades will write. We have posted the schedule online and during these two weeks our focus is to support these students as they show us their learning to date.

HEAD LICE TREATMENT AND PREVENTION

We have had a rash of Head Lice this spring. We do not send home, or prevent students coming to school who have been identified as having them. We make every effort to prevent the spread of them and work with families who may need guidance and help around addressing the issue. Please refrain from publically identifying other children as the "cause" of a head lice case. In 95% of the cases the children who have them were exposed outside of the school at events like birthday parties and sleep overs. In the school we discourage the sharing of hats, scarves, hair brushes and accessories and do not have soft surfaces where they may thrive to prevent the spread. Should you need help dealing with this contact the Health Unit as they have professional services that can guide you. It is critical that if your child does get head lice that you not only treat them, but also do the environmental clean at home. It is a nuisance, but can be addressed. Thank You.

JUNE FUN FAIR: JUNE 11TH (4PM-8PM)

The main fundraiser for our Catholic Parent Council this year will be our Fun Fair. The Council is hoping to raise enough money to finish their purchase of mobile air conditioning units for the main floor of the school. The Council and School Staff have been working very hard to make this a successful event that also promotes their goal of family and parent engagement. There will be a silent auction which will hopefully be the main source of bringing in funds. We are going to send home a donation letter for classes soon. BEING OUTSIDE

In recent years there has been a regional increase in students needing Occupational Therapy and other motor coordination supports. A major contributing factor is their decrease in physical activity to build their core strength and muscle memory. We have many students who openly identify that they do not play outside unless made to at school. This is going to



be a major focus for us in the spring and for the next year. As part of our Stewardship Pillar for the system we believe that children will learn how to respect the environment by being immersed in it. The focus for our Kindergarten Program next year will be Natural Curiosity with students spending large chunks of their day outside exploring and being active in the school green area. You can support the physical growth of your children by limiting the amount of screen time and encouraging them to play outside. This also has a direct link to their social skill development as they learn how to play, negotiate, resolve conflicts and support others through collaborative playing of games and activities. Like anything else physical development and social skills development are things that need to be practiced repeatedly at school and at home.

HOW TO HOLD A PENCIL

One of the biggest challenges we have in teaching children how to write is that they do not know how to hold a pencil. We work diligently on this with them, show them repeatedly how to do



this and then correct them when they need help. You can support us with this by watching at home when they are writing to ensure they are holding it correctly. Children often complain that their hands hurt when they are writing and it is usually due to poor muscle development by not holding the pencil properly. While we have access to technology, we still expect children to physically write using pencil and paper. This will be a focus for the upcoming school year. If you are not sure how they should hold a pencil there are a lot of videos online for you to watch. Just make sure it is a recognized site and one that is supported by Occupational Therapists in Canada.
