

Kingston After School ABA Program Autism Skills Groups

What is an Autism Skills Group?

The Kingston After School ABA Program is offering <u>free</u> Autism Skills Groups to children/youth diagnosed with Autism Spectrum Disorder. The groups will focus on teaching a variety of skills including social, communication, behaviour/emotional regulation, and activities of daily living.

What are some skills my child/youth might learn in a group?

- Problem solving
- Accepting "no"
- Greeting others
- Identifying feelings
- Asking friends to play
- Meal preparation

Who can join?

Students diagnosed with Autism Spectrum Disorder, aged 3 to 21, of the Limestone District School Board and Algonquin and Lakeshore Catholic District School Board.

Groups will be developed based on age, location and skill. Parents may be asked to participate in weekly parent information sessions.

When and where?

The groups will occur weekly and run for 6 weeks. All groups will be scheduled after regular school hours.

The program will be offered at various schools across the Kingston region.

Parents will be required to arrange transportation
