Enjoy the Sun Safely

Protect your skin, protect your eyes



Check the UV index and avoid peak hours

When the UV Index is 3 or higher, protect your skin as much as possible. Plan outdoor activity before 11:00 a.m. and after 3:00 p.m. when you can.

Seek shade

Look for shaded areas or create your own shade.



Cover up

Wear a wide brim hat to protect your head, face, ears, and neck.

Wear loose, tightly woven clothing to protect as much of your skin as possible.

Wear sunglasses or eyeglasses with UV-protective lenses when outdoors all year round.



Use sunscreen

Apply a broad-spectrum UVA and UVB, water resistant sunscreen, with SPF 30 or higher.

Apply a generous amount and reapply after swimming, sweating, or toweling off.

Use a sunscreen lip balm to protect lips.

Children 0-12 are invited to register online or in person at any of KFPL's 16 branches to receive their free bilingual reading notebook, web access code bookmark and stickers!
