Are you a fire extinguisher or a fire starter? Do you strike a match or do you curse the darkness? Our readings this weekend invite us to an honest appraisal of our involvement in the mission of Jesus and therefore the life and mission of our parish community. "I came to bring fire to the earth," declares Jesus. By fire, he refers to the fire of the gospel, the Good News of God's unconditional love and mercy for us.

Fire, we all know, destroys property and life. This is the obvious reason why we install fire extinguishers and have them inspected annually. Further, as soon as there is an outbreak of fire we enlist the help of fire fighters. However, fire also purifies and saves. For instance, fire refines gold, making it pure and precious. As God's beloved Son and Servant, Jesus intends the Gospel to be like a "bush fire" that will spread quickly and extensively, penetrating every human heart, purifying it of all traces of sin and renewing it so that it can love selflessly and perform good deeds. This is a formidable task that requires more hands. This explains why spreading the fire of the gospel is everybody's responsibility and not just that of missionaries, clergy and religious alone. Every baptized Christian has the responsibility, by virtue of his or her baptism to pass on the faith to others by witness and by an authentic practice of the Christian life. Parents especially have the first responsibility to pass on the faith to their children by example and parental guidance. It is important that in our parishes all of us understand and appreciate our mission of carrying on the task of the "bush fire" of Christ so that it can penetrate into every person, family and situation. There may be times when we find the going tough. Yes, it was tough for Jeremiah and many other Christians. It was tough for Jesus himself. That explains why to light this fire of the Gospel he gave up his life on the Cross. We are consequently reminded of the statement of the great St. Augustine: "The Christian is another Christ." We are thus invited to take more seriously our being "another Christ."
