In the second reading of this weekend, St. Paul paints for us a picture of the enormous task of a Christian leader which is to unite everyone into the family of God. Each Christian and therefore each parishioner is called to be a promoter of communion among us and with God. These are the words of St. Paul, "And in that image, there is no room for distinction between Greek and Jew, between circumcised or uncircumcised or between barbarian and Scythian, slave and free man. There is only Christ; he is everything and he is in everything." We are therefore being reminded that we are a faith community, a parish family, bonded together by one faith, one baptism and one Lord Jesus Christ who dwells in all of us.

Our life in Christ manifests itself in Christian attitudes, such as thoughtfulness, kindness, compassion, patience, etc. Besides these attitudes, we must have an eye towards the final goal while keeping an eye on this earth. St. Paul says, "Since you have been brought back to life with Christ, you must look for the things that are in heaven, where Christ is sitting at God's right hand. Let your thoughts be on heavenly things, not on the things that are on the earth."

In the final analysis, our destiny is to be with God in heaven, sharing in the life and love of the Holy Trinity. In so far as our minds are focused on God, rain or shine, we'll never be discouraged even in the face of difficulties and challenges. Therefore, let us welcome this Sunday as an invitation to grow in holiness, for Paul says, "That is why you must kill everything in you that belongs only to the earthly life; fornication, impurity, guilty passion, evil desires and especially greed, which is the same thing as worshipping a false god."
