University Application Process

Four days have been dedicated to informing eligible university and college applicants of the process for applying to university and college. All applications will be done online this year and students require PIN numbers before they can actually submit their applications.

The university PIN numbers are now in but we are still awaiting the college PIN numbers. Students may submit their applications as soon as they receive their PIN numbers, and we have suggested that they submit their applications by the middle of December to ensure there is no deadline anxiety.

If your son or daughter has not taken part in any of the information sessions at the school we suggest that they make an appointment with their guidance counsellor as soon as possible.
