Math Assessment Results

Holy Cross is very pleased with the results of the Grade 9 Mathematics Assessment. It is due in no small part to the preparation our staff and students put into this exercise.

Our academic math program shows that 84% of our students are at/or approaching Level 3, the provincial standard. The board's figure is 77% and the province's figure is 78%.

Our applied level math program shows that 63% of our students are at/or approaching Level 3, the provincial standard. Our board's figure is 52% and the province's figure is 58%.
