The winter sport season **begins late in November** and Holy Cross is again expected to field extremely competitive teams in Wrestling, Curling, Cheerleading, Badminton, Boys' Basketball, Girls' Volleyball, and Girls' and Boys' Hockey.

Holy Cross teams participate as members of **KASSAA**. KASSAA is a teacher run organization which includes all the high schools in Kingston and the surrounding area. Any school in KASSAA becomes a member of **EOSSAA** (Eastern Ontario) and OFSAA (Ontario) which are also teacher run organizations. Provincial championships are held for all **OFSAA** sanctioned sports. This winter, over 170 student athletes from Holy Cross will attempt to compete in these championships. Approximately 50 staff coaches and 16 volunteers will provide these opportunities throughout the year. Both the KASSAA website - <u>www.kassaa.ca</u> and the OFSAA website <u>www.ofsaa.on.ca</u> are excellent resources for schedules, league rules and any general information regarding high school sports.

**Students**, in particular new students entering **grade 9**, are strongly encouraged to get involved in the athletic program at Holy Cross. Athletics offer students an opportunity to enrich their educational development, while promoting an overall feeling of camaraderie and school spirit. Unfortunately, due to the sheer size of our school, most teams require try-outs. However, there are teams each season, such as Wrestling and Badminton, which provide students the opportunity to participate in a High School sport. Many students also get involved by becoming a team manager or a minor official. It is important that any student who wants to become involved has the opportunity. Please discuss any questions regarding athletics with your homeroom teacher.

#### **Boys' Basketball**

The **Senior Boys' Basketball** team will play under the leadership of teacher coach **Mr. Tim Hunter**. Mr. Hunter is looking forward to his first year as the senior basketball coach. The team will be attending 4 tournaments including tournaments in Belleville, Brockville and St. Andrew's. Tryouts will begin mid November while the team's user fee has yet to be decided.

The **Junior Boys' Basketball** team will be looking to improve upon their strong showing last year. Teacher Coaches **Mr. Frank Halligan** and **Mr. Sean Murphy** will be taking the junior Crusaders to 5 tournaments including tournaments in Orleans, Aurora, Peterborough and Belleville. The team will also be hosting the Archbishop Spence Invitational on December 10 and 11. Practices occur daily Monday through Friday after school. Tryouts will begin on November 15 while the team's user fee has yet to be determined.

#### Wrestling

The Wrestling team is lead by teacher coaches Mr. Shawn McDonald and Mr. John Thorburn. The team practices on Tuesday and Thursday from 2:45 until 4:30. Any student wishing to attend practice regularly will be allowed to compete in the meets. The team's user fee will be approximately \$75.

#### Badminton

The **Badminton** team is lead by teacher coaches **Mr. Matt Gervais and Mr. Dan Roberts and Miss Mary Pryal.** The team will start training after Christmas with morning practices. Practices will move to an after school slot as the winter season draws to an end as the team prepares for KASSAA competitions. The team's user fee is \$40.

#### Cheerleading

Holy Cross Cheerleading has developed a reputation nationally as a powerhouse in the sport of cheerleading. Teacher Coach **Mrs. Christine Waters** is returning for her 3<sup>rd</sup> year along with former Cheerleading Crusaders **Miss Stephanie Shea** and **Miss Laura Kittner**. The team practices on Tuesday, Thursday and Sunday evenings. The sport season is intensive and ends at a national championship in the Spring. Tryouts begin at the end of November and the team's user fee is approximately \$200.

#### Girls' Volleyball

The **Senior Girls' volleyball** team, under the leadership of **Mr. Rob Manion** will continue to be a strong competitor. Current students Kyle Kersten and Cooper Johnston will act as assistant coaches. The team plans to attend at least 2 tournaments. The team's user fee is \$80.00.

**Mr. Mike O'Brien** will return as the coach of the **Junior Girls' Volleyball** team. Returning veterans Sarah Splinter, Melissa Ireland, Amber Brent and Joanna Boyle will look to lead the junior Crusaders. The team will be attending 3 tournaments in Kingston including the RMC Invitational. The team's user fee is \$60.

#### **Girls' Hockey**

The **Girls' hockey** team, under the leadership of teacher coach **Mr. Andrew Michalski and Mr. Tony Clarke** will continue to be a KASSAA favorite. The team plans to attend a tournament in Toronto. Any interested girl will be given an opportunity to join this highly competitive team. Tryouts occur in late November. The team's user fee is approximately \$280.00.

#### **Boys' Hockey**

The **Boys' Hockey** team is looking forward to defending their KASSAA title. Lead by teacher coaches **Mr. Rob Zarichny and Mr. Doug Corrigan**, the team will begin the difficult task of selecting the team in late November. The team practices after school on Monday at 3:30 and will be attending a tournament in Toronto in the new year. The team's user fee is approximately \$170.

#### **Curling Team**

In the past, Holy Cross has had a Curling Team. As we have very few practices as a team, members must have experience in the sport. You may get experience at local clubs, such as at the Napanee Curling Club. The curling season begins there on November 7<sup>th</sup> from 7:00-8:30pm (for ages 14-20). Junior curling fees at that club are \$65.00, which includes instruction, skill development, and team play.
