December Pastoral Update

Our School Theme for this year, "Called to Know Jesus" is particularly appropriate as we begin this Advent Season. Over the coming weeks, we are invited to reflect on how we encounter our Messiah, especially in unexpected and surprising ways. Here at Holy Cross we will once again be entering into this season through our Advent Reconciliation Celebration on December 2nd, and through our Advent School Mass on Thursday, December 16th. Our Crusaders in Community Service have already begun our annual Advent Food Drive. This year we will once again challenge Regiopolis-Notre Dame for the Christmas Challenge Cup which Holy Cross claimed for the first time last year. Also, C.I.C.S. is encouraging homeform classes to help send a child to school in Kingston, Jamaica by donating money. It costs approximately \$50.00 to sponsor a child through the St. Patrick's Foundation, a Jamaican charitable organization which we heard about when Mr. Fabian Brown visited our school in October.

Our recent C.I.C.S. Toronto Mission Trip was a tremendous success as six Holy Cross and four Regiopolis-Notre Dame students spent two nights at a homeless shelter in downtown Toronto. With Staff Supervisors, Mr. Forster (H.C.) and Sr. Thacker (RND) in tow, the students gave out lunches to the homeless, worked at a Parkdale soup-kitchen known as St. Francis Table, and took part in a Street Awareness Program called Bridges to Youth. Congratulations to Simon Finn, Kaitlyn Lackie, Nicole Sosnowski, Michelle McTeague, Kate Lightbody, and Dilara Polat for taking time to participate in such a challenging, but worthwhile Mission Experience.

Over 20 Holy Cross students, parents and staff braved the cold, wet weather on November 22nd to take part in this year's **Diabetes Fund-raising Campaign**. They canvassed door-to-door around the Holy Cross area and collected over \$785.00 for this worthy cause. Congratulations to Jessica Villemaire from C.I.C.S. who helped organize the evening.

C.I.C.S. will also be participating in this year's **Habitat Gingerbread House Building Competition on December 5**th at **Queen's University.** Several C.I.C.S.' volunteers will help build and decorate the house as a fund-raiser for a **Habitat Housebuild** which will take place here in Kingston in **March of 2005**. The Holy Cross Student Uniform: Compliance and Enforcement!

Our Board requires the wearing of school uniforms by the students of all it's secondary schools. Wearing the Holy Cross uniform contributes to a positive learning environment in which student achievement is the highest priority. At Holy Cross, we believe that wearing the school uniform enhances student safety, discipline, and school unity, contributing to a positive school learning environment.

This month, each home will receive a letter from me, as Principal, outlining the Holy Cross uniform policy and compliance issues that we as a staff encounter. Mr. Speagle, Ms. Gallant, and I have been visiting classes to review the policy and our expectations. I have directed all staff to address issues of non-compliance with increased vigilance. All students will be given ample warning this month to have their uniform in full compliance as of Monday, January 3rd, 2005. I am concerned that a significant number of our female students wear kilts which are not in compliance with school policy (7.5 cm , or 3 inches above the knee). As of the new year, our female students will be required to wear either a kilt that conforms to the policy or grey slacks that are purchased from Newman's. Notice given this month will provide ample time for students to either have their uniform altered, or for the purchase of uniform items that conform to policy. EQAO Grade 9 Assessment of Mathematics

In January 2005, Holy Cross students who are currently enrolled in a grade 9 Applied or Academic course will join others in a province wide standardized Grade Nine Math Test. Last year's provincial, Board and school results will be released shortly and will soon be available at www.eqao.com. In January, the mandatory assessment will involve multiple choice questions, short answer and extended responses. This test which is one component of the Secondary School Reform initiative, will be administered over two of the students' regular mathematics classes. Dates for the testing at Holy Cross are January 14th and 15th. Additional information can be obtained from teachers in the Mathematics Department.

Special Education Department Updates

We are seeing an increased use of assistive technology among students. Text-to-speech (Kurzweil) and voice-to-text (Dragon Naturally Speaking) software is available for use while students write tests and complete assignments. We are looking forward to the near future when our assistive technology lab is fully operational. Grade nine students taking General Learning Strategies courses are being trained to use Kurzweil and Dragon Naturally Speaking. There is great enthusiasm among them and all, without exception, are excited about the possibilities offered to them by this software.

The **Transportation Technology** department here at Holy Cross is more than just a classroom, it is a rich learning environment that focuses on the practical application of knowledge learned. Students work on a variety of vehicles provided by staff, parents and students themselves. While there, students learn the basics of: tire repairs, balancing, rotation, and changing flat tires; engine tune-ups; diagnosis and repair of cooling systems, electrical systems (small to medium repairs), suspension systems; minor rust repair and prevention; welding, cutting and fabrication; small engine diagnosis, repair and maintenance; diagnosis and repair of fuel injection and ignition systems; brake relining and machining. College/University Applications :

Ontario Youth Apprenticeship Program

Students select one of four career paths after leaving high school - University, Apprenticeship, College, or the World of Work. The Ontario Youth Apprenticeship Program (OYAP) is a viable government sponsored high school program offered by the Algonquin & Lakeshore CDSB that provides career opportunities in approximately 130 apprenticeable trades areas. The reality of high school students pursuing a career in the trades is growing in popularity, and as a result, the OYAP initiative is receiving increased support from the Ontario Ministry of Education and the Ministry of Training Colleges and Universities (MTCU). It should be noted that careers in skilled trades and technology areas are in demand and they offer good wages and rewarding work. According to the MTCU (September, 2004) there are 12000 students in 650 high schools in Ontario participating in OYAP this year.

Updates:

- All grade 10 career classes in the Board are in the process of receiving a presentation about OYAP.
- Over 2500 students attended a very successful Skilled Trades Fair in Belleville on October 14^{th.}
- Plans are under way for the Kingston Skilled Trades Fair which will be held on April 9th at the Catarogui Town Centre.
- Level One college apprenticeship programs for OYAP high school students are being offered in second semester at Cobourg (Construction Craft Worker), Loyalist College (Automotive, Cooks apprenticeship) and St. Lawrence College (Carpentry).

Information about OYAP may be obtained from the Guidance Department or cooperative education teacher in any of the Board's high schools.
