#### **PASTORAL SERVICES UPDATE**

TSUNAMI RELIEF: Our school raised close to \$4,500.00 for Development & Peace, a Catholic Relief Organization, which is helping to rebuild communities and lives in the devastated areas of South Asia. Students donated close to \$2700.00 through a Loonie-for-No-Uni dressdown day in early January, as well as individual donations. Staff held a Soup & Bread Lunch which, together with other donations, raised close to \$1800.00. **R.N.D. JAMAICA MISSION TRIP:** We are supporting RND as they prepare for an eight day visit to **Kingston, Jamaica** from Feb. 4 - 11, 2005. The six students together with their Coordinator of Pastoral Services will be working at a home for physically and mentally handicapped children. We are planning to return to Kingston, Jamaica next year. **COMMUNITY OUTREACH:** Holy Cross C.I.C.S.' students continue to visit seniors at Rosewood Retirement **Home** on a bi-weekly basis. Our <u>School Choir</u> put on a wonderful concert on January 13<sup>th</sup> and will be singing again at Providence Manor at a special ceremony on February 17th. ASH WEDNESDAY & LENT: Once again, students and staff will begin their Lenten observance here at Holy Cross with the reception of ashes at the end of Mass and with the invitation to "Know Jesus" through repentance, sacrifice, and the giving of alms during the 40 days of Lent. We will have Morning Prayer for students and staff in the Chapel on Friday mornings during Lent at 8:00 a.m. As well, we will have a celebration of Reconciliation on March 3 and a Holy Week Liturgy on Tuesday, March 22. Due to the early start of Lent this year, we want to help us make Breakfast on Tuesday, Feb. 15<sup>th</sup>. ## THE FACTS ABOUT TANS

Along with the winter's cold and snowy days come plans for trips south to sunny and warm weather. Many students will head towards the tanning salons to get a "base tan", preparing for their holidays and increasing their risk of getting melanoma, a deadly form of skin cancer.

THE FACTS: Several studies have shown a significant association between the use of artificial tanning devices and malignant melanoma. The use of tanning beds by adolescents, particularly older teenage girls, is quite prevalent, and continues to rise. No tan is a safe tan. The KFL&A Health Unit will have a display set up during a lunch hour in mid February to provide students with accurate information about the harmful effects of ultraviolet radiation, so that they may make informed decisions about the use of tanning devices.
