# INTERNET BULLYING STUDY

**Dr. Wendy Craig** and a group of researchers from the **Psychology Department** at **Queen's University** are interested in learning more about internet bullying and about how much time students spend on the internet, the activities they do, and the people they meet there. Parents of students in grades 9, 10 and 11 will soon receive more information about this important study in the mail. These students will be invited to participate in this research study on Wednesday, October 26th in their period 2 class.

Parents who do not wish for their child to participate in the study can complete the form provided in the mail, or call Julie Blais, M.A. from the Internet Bullying Research team at 533-6000, ext 75519.

On Wednesday, October 26th, students will be asked to complete a 40 minute questionnaire. The researchers will return on May 17th, 2006 to distribute a follow-up questionnaire. This questionnaire will allow the researchers to see how things have changed since the fall by having students complete the same survev.

Students who participate in the internet Bullying Study will be entered in a draw for an MP3 player. The Internet Bullying Research Team will be available to give talks about bullying on the internet and healthy internet friendships. Pamphlets will also be available for those who wish to learn more about the study. Finally, we will provide a summary report to the school of the results of the study.
