Holy Cross Athletics

The winter sport season begins late in November and Holy Cross is again expected to field extremely competitive teams in Wrestling, Curling, Cheerleading, Badminton, Boys' Basketball, Girls' Volleyball, and Girls' and Boys' Hockey.

This winter, over 170 student athletes from Holy Cross will attempt to compete in these championships. Approximately 50 staff coaches and 16 volunteers will provide these opportunities throughout the year. Boys' Basketball

Teacher coaches **Mr. Tim Hunter** and **Mr. Robin Dzierniejk**o look forward to a new season with the Senior Boys' Basketball team. A large returning cast, as well as a strong group of 1st year players will hopefully allow the team to improve upon last year's strong showing. They will be attending tournaments in Belleville, Brockville, Ottawa and Toronto. Tryouts will begin mid-November, while the team's user fee has yet to be decided.

The Junior Boys' Basketball team will be looking to improve upon their season last year. Teacher Coaches Mr. Frank Halligan and Mr. Sean Murphy will be taking the junior Crusaders to tournaments in Orleans and Belleville. The team will also be hosting the Archbishop Spence Invitational on December 2 and 3. Practices occur daily Monday through Friday after school. Tryouts will begin on November 14 while the team's user fee has yet to be determined.

Wrestling

The **Wrestling** team will begin in mid November. The team practices on Tuesday and Thursday from 2:45 until 4:30. Any student wishing to attend practice regularly will be allowed to compete in the meets. The team's user fee will be approximately \$75.

Badminton

The **Badminton** team is lead by teacher coaches **Mr. Matt Gervais** and **Mr. Dan Roberts and Miss Mary Pryal.** The team will start

training after Christmas with morning practices. Practices will move to an after school slot as the winter season draws to an end as the team prepares for KASSAA competitions. The team's user fee is \$40.

Cheerleading

The Cheerleading team will be looking to improve upon its 3rd place finish at Nationals last year. Teacher advisor Ms. Christine Waters is returning for her 4th year, and will be joined by former Crusader cheerleaders Miss Whitney Kittner, Miss Tara Murphy, and Miss Clare Slack. There will be a special clinic for Grade 9 girls interested in trying out on November 8th and 10th, with regular clinics beginning on November 15th for all grades. The sports season is intensive, with practices on Tuesday, Thursday, and some Sunday evenings, and ends with a National Championship in May. The team's user fee is approximately \$200.

Girls' Volleyball

The **Senior Girls' volleyball** team, under the leadership of **Ms. Naomi Forder** will continue to be a strong competitor. The team plans to attend at least one tournament. The team's user fee is \$80.00.

Mr. Mike O'Brien with the assistance of Mrs. Kristie LeSarge and student coaches Heather Donohue, Joanna Boyle will coach the Junior Girls' Volleyball team. Possible returning veterans are Emily Holmes, Brianne Murphy and Macey Niellison. The team will be attending 3 tournaments in Kingston including the RMC Invitational. The team's user fee is \$60.

Girls' Hockey

The **Girls' hockey** team, under the leadership of teacher coach **Mr. Andrew Michalski** will continue to be a KASSAA favourite. The team plans to attend a tournament in Toronto. Any interested girl will be given an opportunity to join this highly competitive team. **Tryouts occur November 15**th **and 22**nd. The team's user fee is approximately \$250.00.

Boys' Hockey

The Boy's Hockey team is looking forward to starting the new season. Led by teacher coaches Mr. Rob Zarichny and Mr. Dave Jarrell, the difficult task of selecting the team will begin on Monday, November 14th. The regular season begins at the end of November and a tournament has been booked in Toronto at Beatrice Ice Gardens on December 5th. The team user fee will approximately be \$150.
