PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

On October $5^{\text {th }}$, we issued our Early Semester Report Cards to students. This was an early indicator of each student's achievement in the first five weeks of this semester. The first half of the semester will end on Tuesday, November $7^{\text {th }}$ and then on Friday, November 17 ${ }^{\text {th }}$ the Mid-semester Report Cards will be distributed in Period One classes. This Report Card provides extensive reporting in each subject including: a percentage grade; course median; absences/lates; Learning Skills and personal comments on the individual student's strengths, weaknesses and next steps. There is ample time left in the semester for students to improve their marks and do well in each course. If a student's mark is below $50 \%$, this indicates the need to examine the work to date. This month will be a time to
 review academic strategies, goals and objectives for the school year. A discussion with the teacher will help you plan for maintaining the achievement level or ways to improve the student's mark.

Fall sports are proceeding well and all of our teams are putting in a great effort. Thanks to the coaches, managers, community volunteers, and students for always making us proud to see the Green and Silver on the courts and fields. Thanks also to the parents for coming to the games and showing incredible support!
