#### PRINCIPAL'SMESSAGE

As we head into the March Break, I express my appreciation to all students and staff for the great start to Semester II. Our community is blessed to have so many dedicated and talented members who share their time and talents with one another. I offer my congratulations on behalf of our community to the following: the organizers of the 18th Annual Memorial hosted at Holy Cross on February 8th. Approximately \$16,000 was raised through ticket sales to the boys' basketball games, 50/50 draws, Silent Auction, T-shirt sales, and the two day elementary schools' basketball tournament; the Holy Cross Swimming Team with Philip Arnold, Ryan Coens, and Andrew Klenke, who have qualified for the All-Ontario Championships on March 6th and 7th in Etobicoke; the Holy Cross Improv team comprised of Sheila Edwards, Simon Finn, Melissa Davis, Rob Taylor, Graham Slaughter, Brianna Roberts, Mike Cox and Cassie Berry under the direction of Ms. Carrie Rose which placed 3<sup>rd</sup> on an emotionally-combustible Saturday evening in the Eastern Regional Improv games; the Holy Cross Bands, which competed in the **Annual Kiwanis Festival** at Holy Cross on February 22<sup>nd</sup> and 23<sup>rd</sup> under the Direction of Mr. David Orser and Mrs. Diane McCombs: Laura Martindale who will be participating in the Canada Winter Games in the Yukon as a member of the U-18 Ontario hockey team; Chas Murphy, Jen Brulé, and Brynn Hutzler who competed at the All-Ontario OFSAA Wrestling Championships in Brampton where Chas Murphy won Gold; our Cheerleading Team that won best overall in our KASSAA and regional competitions and will compete in the nationals in early May: Technology Department Head Mr. John Esford who was awarded the Kingston Tech Council **Dick Hopkins Innovation in** Education Award.

In order to maintain an atmosphere that is centered on learning, we are reinforcing some initiatives such as the **cell phone use policy** you can read about later in this newsletter, a **proxy server** that blocks inappropriate internet sites from school computers, and visits from the **Health Unit's Bylaw Enforcement Officer** to monitor and respond to smoking on school property. For the first time, we will be running **Lockdown Drills**, to rehearse what staff and students should do in the unlikely event that a dangerous intruder invades our school; this practice is intended to inform and empower rather than alarm. An exciting initiative is the **Crusader Express Card** for students to use in our cafeteria. More information will follow.

Improv Share Lent Show **TAIZE VISITOR:** We welcomed **Br. Felix** from the **Taizé** community in France to our school on **Tuesday**, **Feb. 27**th. He visited religion classes and led a Taizé Prayer Service in the Chapel after school. Students and staff were deeply touched by his joyful presence and beautiful singing. As a result of his visit, some of us are considering attending the **Taizé** Youth Conference which will be held in Montreal at the end of April.

SHARE LENT CAMPAIGN: We are once again encouraging donations to Share Lent through home form classes, bake sales and other fundraising activities during lent. This year our monies will be going to support an Apprenticeship & Trades' program at St. Margaret's School in Kingston, Jamaica through the St. Patrick's Foundation. We will also be helping a school sponsored by the Sisters of Providence in Chiricaja, Guatemala and supporting international development programs through the Catholic Organization for Development & Peace. The A.L.C.D.S.B. is also encouraging schools across the Board to examine the use of soft-plastic water bottles by students and staff in an effort to discourage their use and to promote the use of tap water or hard plastic water bottles instead. There will be a presentation to the school community on March 22<sup>nd</sup> which is "World Water Day". We will also be selling "Holy Cross" hard-plastic water bottles during Lent: 500 ml bottles are \$5.00, while the 1 liter bottle will cost \$6.00. See Students' Council or Mr. Forster to order one.

LENT: Once again, we began the season of Lent here at Holy Cross with Ash Wednesday Mass and with the distribution of ashes at the end of Mass as a symbol of our common need for repentance and conversion. As Christians, we are encouraged to follow the traditional observances of fasting, abstinence and almsgiving throughout the 40 days of Lent. We will have a celebration of Reconciliation for the school community on March 1st, a Staff Way of the Cross on April 4th, and a Holy Week Liturgy for the school also on Wednesday, April 4th to help us to enter into the spirit of this penitential season.

THINKFAST: Our annual 25-Hour Thinkfast will take place from March 30<sup>th</sup> - 31<sup>st</sup>. Students will be asked to collect pledges for the Catholic Organization for Development & Peace and to fast from solid food for 25 hours as part of this overnight experience. May all of our students, staff and families enter deeply into this holy season of Lent and experience new meaning in the Easter that awaits us all.

#### LITERACYTESTING

The Literacy Test will be written on **Thursday**, **March 29**<sup>th</sup>, **2007**. A Literacy Test preparation class is being presented to all Grade 10 students. A practice booklet has been sent home with the students. This year, the test will be conducted on one day for two ninety- minute sessions. In order to serve the test writers properly, our **Grade 11** and **12** students not writing the test are granted an **Independent Study Day** (at home) on **March 29**<sup>th</sup>. Grade 9 classes will run as regularly scheduled.

# CELLPHONEPOLICY

The use of cell phones should primarily be used in emergency situations and should not interfere with student learning and individual privacy. According to the **Safe Schools Act**, photographs can not be published without consent of the individual being photographed.

Cell phones may not be used and **must** be powered off ( not on silent or vibrate) while a student is in the classroom or during school-sponsored activities during the regular instructional day, such as school Masses, exams, or student assemblies. Students may use their cell phones **only** in the cafeteria and the student commons before and after school hours and during the lunch hour and student spares.

A cell phone that disrupts class or a student assembly will be taken by the teacher, given to the administration and returned at the end of the day. A second violation will result in the phone being taken for the day and returned to the parent the next day. Additional disruptions may result in suspension. Holy Cross does not assume responsibility for lost or stolen electronic devices.

Several young people signed up for Quit 4 Life, a ten week smoking cessation program facilitated by Ms. Melville. #### KIWANISMUSICFESTIVALRESULTS

Congratulations to the Holy Cross Crusader Bands for their stellar performance in the Kiwanis Music Festival. First place honours went to the Senior Wind Ensemble and the Symphonic Band while the Junior Band received Second Place in the Junior Competitive Category. # COUNSELLORS'CORNER

#### COURSESFLECTION

At this time of year, students begin the process of selecting courses for the 2007-2008 academic year. It is critical for all students who plan on returning to Holy Cross that they follow the timelines in order to ensure that they are able to obtain the courses they desire.

Grade assemblies were conducted outlining the on-line course selection process. Access to this process is available through home computers. In-school assistance is offered at lunch. Target date for completion of course selections is **March 7**th, **2007**.

All students in Grades 9, 10, 11 are required to carry a course load of 4 courses each semester. Only students who have obtained at least 24 credits may have a spare; Grade 12 students with 24 or more credits must carry a minimum of three courses each semester.

#### CHASMURPHY TAKES HOME OF SAA GOLD!

Chas Murphy, a Grade 11 student at Holy Cross, recently won a gold medal at the 2007 Wrestling Championships, held in Brampton, Ontario. Chas was seeded #3 out of 28 of Ontario's top wrestlers in the 44kg category. Chas rolled through the competition winning all of his matches by pinning his opponents. Chas now has his sights set on a gold medal at the National Championships to be held April 13th - 15th. Chas is the third wrestler from Holy Cross to reach such a high level of achievement in wrestling. Others who have won gold at OFSAA: Paul Ragusa 1989, 1991 (47.5kg category) and Mike Kuba 1991 (57.5kg category). Good Luck at Nationals, Chas!

The winter season comes to a close as the spring season starts up. Holy Cross will be represented at O.F.S.A.A. in swimming on March 6<sup>th</sup> and 7<sup>th</sup> by Ryan Coens, Philip Arnold and Andrew Klenke, wrestling on March 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> by Chas Murphy, Jen Brulé, and Brynn Hutzler. Holy Cross Cheerleaders regained their winning form by capturing the K.A.S.S.A.A. and regional championships this past month. They will compete at the nationals in Kitchener on the weekend of May 11<sup>th</sup>.

Badminton season hits full stride in March and April. The badminton team will compete in the following events: Singles tournament – Thursday, February 22<sup>nd</sup> at Regiopolis-Notre Dame, Doubles – Monday, March 5<sup>th</sup> at LCVI, Mixed – Wednesday, April 4<sup>th</sup> at Lasalle, KASSAA Finals Open – Wednesday, April 11<sup>th</sup> at LCVI, and Juniors – Thursday, April 19<sup>th</sup> at HC.

This spring, over 200 student athletes from Holy Cross will compete for KASSAA and EOSSA championships. The team will travel to two tournaments. Tryouts will begin after March break with practices after school. The team's user fee will be \$110.

The Junior Boys' Soccer team will be looking to improve upon their strong showing last year. Teacher Coaches Mr. Bob Bouvier, and Mr. Pat Murphy will be taking the Junior Crusaders to one tournament at LaSalle. Practices occur daily Monday through Friday after school. Tryouts will begin after March Break.

#### Girls' Soccer

The **Senior Girls**' team is led by teacher coach **Mr. Richard Coleman**. The team practices after school. The **Junior Girls**' team is lead by teacher coaches **Mrs. Patsy Hawkins-Hogan** and **Mrs. Marie Hulse**. The team will have some morning practices and some after school practices.

# Rugby

All three Rugby teams are coached by the same coaching staff led by Mr. Mike Chambers, Mr. Dave Jarrell and Mr. John Clark. Official team tryouts begin after the March break. The teams practise daily after school and each new player is required to purchase team kit. The Senior Boys team will attend two tournaments: in Toronto and Guelph. The Junior Boys team looks to build on the success of the junior football team as they vie for the KASSAA championship. The Girls' team again looks to be strong. They and the juniors will attend two tournaments. All three teams have a \$60 user fee separate from tournament and kit costs.

Any interested student, willing to practise regularly will be given an opportunity to join this highly competitive team. Try-outs occur late in March. The team's user fee is approximately \$100.
