The focus of the camp is on educational workshops, including information about study strategies, adaptive technology and study tips. Students will have orientation with the Counselling and Disability Services Department and the college in general, while experiencing living in residence. Parents are invited to a "guestion and answer" session on the final day of the program. On Wednesday, August 29th, all students with disabilities are also encouraged to attend the St. Lawrence Disability Services Orientation. SCHOOL TEXTBOOKS

We are very pleased with the responsible way in which students are dealing with textbooks. As we have requested, students are bringing in books needing repair. Prevention like this avoids students having to pay charges for repair or replacement at the end of term. Texts for this semester are due back no later than the day of each student's last exam. As always, it is best to return items personally to the **Textbook Room** or to the **Library**, rather than leaving items in the classroom or exam room. **HC textbooks are due back on the day of the individual student's final exam**. All textbooks for **senior courses** are due back by **Tuesday**, **June 19th** and by **Friday**, **June 22nd** for **junior courses**. HC students are to personally **return the textbooks they were issued** to the Textbook Room or to the Library, to ensure that their account is cleared.

We expect textbook return to run very smoothly this June. Each student receives, in early June, a personalized report of the titles signed out to her/him. This is distributed in homeroom. It is a task of only a few minutes to double check the barcodes and titles for accuracy. There is, unfortunately, a small percentage of problems which arise at the end of each semester. Please do not allow your son or daughter to be counted in this group. If books are not returned, or are damaged, we will be cashing **\$100.00 deposit cheques** starting **June 29th**.
