## HOLY CROSSLATE POLICY

The staff at Holy Cross has agreed, with the support of our Catholic School Council, that a consistent approach to submission of **major summative assessments** will encourage students to be responsible and to adhere to good time management skills. For major summative assignments and tasks, the teacher sets a **Due Date** and a **Closure Date**; the teacher communicates this information to students. *It is the clear expectation that students will hand in all assignments on the date due.* In the occasional circumstance where a student is unable to submit a major culminating assignment on the date due, the student must discuss this matter with his or her teacher at the earliest possible date. The purpose of the three-day window of opportunity allows for a mechanism to deal with issues such as — a family issue, computer problems, work schedule, assignments for other classes, etc. — and still get the assignment in without penalty. Students can expect the following:

- assignments submitted on the date due will be collected;
- submissions one school day after due date will be collected;
- assignments handed in two school days late will be collected;

- three school days late will receive a 5 % mark deduction;
- four school days after the original date will be the ultimate deadline with a 10 % mark deduction, after which time there will be no further opportunities to hand in the assignment.

This *five-day window* will allow students and teachers to move on to the next learning opportunity and may clearly indicate to all concerned if a student falls into a pattern that is disruptive to his or her learning. **Failure to submit summative assignments will have a negative impact on the final grade.**

## UNIFORM POLICY

As we begin the second semester and new classes and routines are forming, we revisit existing expectations at Holy Cross. In particular, we expect that students will be in full compliance with our uniform policy as outlined in the Code of Conduct, found in student agendas and on our school website, [www.hctoday.ca](http://www.hctoday.ca).

I encourage parents to see that their sons and daughters wear the proper uniform to Holy Cross. The uniform must be worn modestly; kilts are expected to be no shorter than two inches from the top of the knee and shirts / blouses must be neither too loose nor too tight. Throughout the day, students should wear dress shoes, and have buttons done up and shirts tucked in.

We all have a role to play! It is our expectation that parents will give full support to the wearing of uniform, and ensure, with the student, that the uniform is ready for wearing on each school day. We suggest that the students themselves should take on much of this responsibility. As you may be aware, students who arrive at school missing some part of the uniform must report to the office before classes begin and often, we are able to loan uniforms for the day. Students who do not return loaned items will face consequences such as study hall.

A progressive system of intervention will be put into place to deal with uniform violations, up to and including suspension from school for persistent opposition to authority. Girls who roll up their kilt or continuously wear too short a kilt will have their parents notified and will receive school consequences. Some students may be advised to let down the hem of their kilts. Students who demonstrate an unwillingness to comply and cooperate with their teachers and other school authorities on this matter will not remain in our school.

## SAFESCHOOLS, BILL 212

On **June 4<sup>th</sup>, 2007**, **Bill 212** of the *Education Act* was unanimously passed by the provincial government. **As of February 1, 2008 all aspects of Bill 212 will come into play.** Changes to this act will impact how the behaviour, discipline and safety of our students is handled. Working with the changes to the *Act*, Holy Cross will continue to provide all members of our community with a positive school climate in which to learn and grow scholastically, socially and spiritually.

We conducted our first drill earlier in the fall. If you know that your son or daughter may be nervous about this topic, please discuss the nature and purpose of the drill with him or her ahead of time.

Another major fundraiser for our **Share Lent** campaign will be the **Thinkfast** on **Friday, February 29<sup>th</sup>**. Students will be seeking donations and sponsors over the coming weeks as they commit themselves to fasting for 25-hours in support of **Development & Peace's** third world projects. Shortly afterwards is this year's **Service Learning Trip** to **Kingston, Jamaica** which will take place from **March 7-18<sup>th</sup>**. Sixteen students and staff will be volunteering at several projects sponsored by **St. Patrick's Foundation** and learning about the culture and religious life of the Jamaican people. Let us begin this new semester with renewed hearts and minds. And may God's blessing be with all of us as we begin our Lenten journey of prayer, repentance and almsgiving on Ash Wednesday.

## CRUSADER ATHLETICS - THE MEMORIAL AND FULL COURT PRESS AGAINST CANCER

February will be a busy month for the athletic department as the winter season comes to an end and playoffs begin. Added to this excitement is the annual cancer fundraiser, "**The Memorial**" which takes place at the beginning of the month.

On **Thursday, February 7<sup>th</sup>**, **The Memorial** Basketball games will be hosted here at **Regiopolis-Notre Dame Catholic High School** with the **Junior Varsity game beginning at 6:00** and the **Senior game scheduled to begin at 7:30**. The Memorial was established by **Paul Halligan** in **1989** as a testament to a young basketball player, **Peter Carty**, who lost his fight against cancer at the age of 23. Paul Halligan died in July 1997 at the age of 34 as a victim of the very disease that had taken his friend, **Peter Carty**, thirteen years earlier. The popular "**Toonie for a Non-uni**" in support of the Memorial will take place on **Thursday, February 7<sup>th</sup>**. Students have prepaid for this day when they submitted their Crusader Comprehensive Activity Fee earlier this year. ## COUNSELLOR'S CORNER

### COURSELOAD

All students in Grades 9, 10, 11 are required to carry a course load of 4 courses each semester. All students in Grade 12 are required to carry a minimum of 3 courses each semester.

### COURSE CHANGES/DELETIONS

Students are to consult a counsellor prior to making any changes to their timetable. It is "advised" that any required course changes be dealt with by the end of the first week of semester two. Furthermore, it is "required" that all changes be completed by the end of the **second** week of the semester.

### COURSE SELECTION PROCESS

At this time of year, students begin the process of selecting courses for the 2008-2009 academic year. It is critical for all students who plan on returning to Holy Cross that they follow the timelines in order to ensure that they are able to obtain the courses they desire. **Holy Cross will be conducting the on-line process of selection of courses.** The deadline for completing this process is **Friday, February 29<sup>th</sup>, 2008.**

### GRADE 8 PARENT INFORMATION NIGHT

Grade 8 Parent Information Night will be hosted on **Wednesday, February 13<sup>th</sup>, 2008 at 7:00 p.m.** This evening is open to Grade Eight students and their parents/guardians. ### THE ONTARIO YOUTH APPRENTICESHIP PROGRAM (OYAP)

There are over 150 skilled trades in Ontario, and forecasts indicate there are extreme shortages of workers in many of these areas. The province expects to register 24,000 new apprentices this year; however, there are indications that this number will not keep up with the on-going demand for skilled trade workers. To assist in this regard, OYAP helps young people to "jump start" their careers while still enrolled in high school. Full-time senior students who are at least 16 years of age and have an interest in a skilled trade/occupation are eligible to apply.

### QUIT 4 LIFE

Have you thought about quitting smoking? This is your opportunity to find ways that might help you. "Quit 4 Life" is a supportive group program for students who want to quit. Quit 4 Life is coming to Holy Cross CSS soon and at noon on **Tuesday, February 12<sup>th</sup>**, you will see a Quit 4 Life display in the main lobby to answer any questions you might have. This is a voluntary program for a group of students and a sign-up sheet will be available for those wishing to attend. You can also directly contact your Holy Cross Youth Worker, **Terrie Hoey**, to let her know you are interested. The first Quit 4 Life session will be held in the Youth Worker Office, **Rm 238** on **Tuesday, Feb 12<sup>th</sup>**, during **Period Three**. The program will then run each Tuesday until **April 8<sup>th</sup>**.

## SUPPLEMENTAL LITERACY PROGRAM

The after-school literacy program, designed to boost reading and writing skills and to help students gain confidence in preparation for the **Literacy Test on Thursday, March 27<sup>th</sup>**, will begin in the second week of February. All students must successfully complete the Literacy Test (or subsequently enroll in and complete the Grade 12 Literacy Course) in order to obtain an Ontario Secondary School Diploma. ## SPECIAL EDUCATION AND RESOURCE

**Semester I Report Cards with attached Individual Education Plans:** Read the subject teacher and SERT comments. Using this data, parents/guardians are asked to discuss the relationship between marks and use of accommodations so that their son/daughter understands the connection.

**Opportunities for Grade 11 and 12:** The **Queen's On-Line to Success Course** is offered by **Queen's** for students with learning disabilities heading to **any** university or college in **2008 or 2009**. This course begins on **March 19<sup>th</sup> and 20<sup>th</sup>** at **Duncan MacArthur Hall** and is designed to help students learn more about their own learning styles, self-advocacy skills, adaptive technologies, and post-secondary learning strategies. **Identification, Placement and Review Committee Meetings (IPRCs):** Parents of students identified as exceptional learners are asked to set up an appointment for this year's Identification, Placement and Review Committee meeting by calling **Mrs. Decaire**, secretary at **613-384-1919 ext.3405**.

**Collaborative Services Model for Students with Autism Spectrum Disorder:** **Algonquin and Lakeshore Catholic District School Board** has been chosen by the Ministry to show our model of best practice. One focus is to look at Transitions into high school, transitions between grades and then into the community. Holy Cross **Special Education Department, Bridges Life Skills Program and Bridges to Community over 18 Program** have been invited to highlight our best practices. In return, we will receive increased support.

**Post-secondary Transition Planning:** There are a variety of scholarships available for students with learning disabilities. The **Mattison Endowment Fund Scholarship for Disabled Students** is a one year award of **\$2,500** for undergraduate studies in a degree-granting program (deadline of **June 1<sup>st</sup>**); the **Roy Cooper Scholarship Award 2008** offers a \$1,000 award for students with a learning disability entering engineering or a physical sciences discipline in university or college (deadline of **May 28<sup>th</sup>**); **Imperial Tobacco Canada Limited Scholarship for Disabled Students** offers **\$5,000** annually towards college or university (deadline is **June 1<sup>st</sup>**). There are also four **LDAC** scholarships, all with application deadlines of **May 15<sup>th</sup>**, for students with learning disabilities. ## ONTARIO SECONDARY SCHOOL LITERACY TEST (OSSLT)

The Ontario Secondary School Literacy Test has been scheduled by the Ministry of Education for **Thursday, March 27<sup>th</sup>**. **Holy Cross will be conducting the test between 8:30 and 11:15 a.m.** All Grade 10 students who are working towards an OSSD will write the test. In addition, students who have not yet completed the test, for example because they have arrived from out of province or because they were not successful in their first sitting, will also prepare for the test. Any student in Grade 11 or 12 who needs to fulfill this graduation requirement should see **Ms. Daniel** or a **Guidance Counselor** in order to receive preparatory materials. All Grade 10 students will be reviewing their literacy skills once/ twice a week for a four week period prior to the test date. Each component of the test will be reviewed with students during these classes. Grade 10 students will receive a copy of a workbook entitled, "**The Ontario Secondary School Literacy Test Workbook**" that they will be using in their literacy classes. Students are encouraged to take this workbook home for continuous review. Parents and students may obtain additional practice materials, student resources, and sample questions and answers at the Education Quality and Accountability Office website at **www.eqao.com** under the link 'Student Resources'. Students who are not successful will retake the test next year or may enroll in the Literacy Course.

## IMMUNIZATION MESSAGE

Students between the ages of 14 and 16 need a booster of tetanus, diphtheria and pertussis (dTaP) called Adacel. They are also eligible for Meningococcal C vaccine between the ages of 15 and 19. **KFL&A Public Health** will be holding clinics at all secondary schools in the new year. Our clinic will be held during the morning of **Wednesday, April 16<sup>th</sup>**.

If your child receives a booster at the doctor's office, ask the office to send the information to **KFL&A Public Health** or you may call the automated vaccine reporting line at **613- 549-1232 ext. 445** or **1-800-267-7875 ext. 445** to give them an update.
