SPECIAL EDUCATION AND RESOURCE NEWS

On Friday May 2rd and Saturday May 3rd, 2008 SLC will host a transition camp for students (10 from HC) with Learning Disabilities and/or AD/HD on their Kingston cangus. Any student who has been diagnosed with a learning disability and or AD/HD, and has an interest in attending college in 2008/ 09 is eligible to apply for attendance at this camp. The focus of the camp is on educational workshops which will include information about study strategies, adaptive technology and survival tips as well as general orientation to the College while having the experience of living in residence. Students will receive relevant information pertaining to registering with the Disability Services, accommodations and assessment processes. Parents will be invited to attend a "Question and Answer" session with the Counselling and Disability Services Staff on the final day of the program.

The second part of the transition program is the **Destination: St. Law**rence Orientation Day, to be held on **Wednesday, August 27th, 2008.** All students with disabilities are encouraged to attend this event.

Eco Tip #6: With the warm weather so quickly upon us, it won't be long before we turn to the air conditioner for relief. There are several ways to keep your house cool without using all that energy. Turn the thermostat up one or two degrees and close south and west-facing curtains during the day for any window that gets direct sunlight. Low energy ceiling fans help to circulate the air and opening the windows in the evening when the outside air has cooled can help cool the house down naturally.
