PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

As we head into the March Break, I express my appreciation to all students and staff for the great start to Semester Two. World Day of Prayer is an international, ecumenical, prayer movement initiated and carried out by Christian women in more than 180 countries and over 1000 languages. Every year, Christians of many traditions and all ages, celebrate a common day of prayer on the first Friday in March, this year Friday, March 6th, 2009. God invites us to have a prayer relationship with Himself, but He also expects us to have concerned relationships with our neighbours, throughout the world. Prayer must be accompanied by action, as God moves our hearts and directs our thoughts.

The motto of the World Day of Prayer movement is *Informed Prayer and Prayerful Action*. Through participation in the World Day of Prayer, we affirm that prayer and action are inseparable and that both have immeasurable influence on the world. This year the service comes from Guyana with the theme of *In Christ*, there are many members, yet one body. Locally, the World Day of Prayer will take place at Princess Street United Church, 484 Albert Street, Kingston on Friday, March 6th, 2009, at 2:00 pm.

Queen's University graduate psychology students are training twenty nine of our students in bullying prevention. The education training workshops sessions, held at lunch in the lecture theatre, train our students who in turn will present the workshops to their peers. The

program called "I Decide-The Bystander" is endorsed by the Ontario Ministry of Education. The program promotes bystanders to intervene on behalf of a teen who is being victimized.

Bullying intervention workshops are scheduled for Period Two Grade 9 classes on Tuesday, March 10th, 2009. More than one-half the time, bullying stops within 10 seconds of a bystander stepping in to help.

The final marks for on-line and night school courses must be submitted to Student Services by Tuesday, June 16th, 2009. Students may contact their counselor regarding any questions concerning graduation.

LITERACY TESTING

The Literacy Test will be written on **Thursday, April** 2nd, 2009. A Literacy Test preparation class is being presented to all **Grade 10 students**. A practice booklet has been sent home with the students. This year, the test will be conducted on one day for two ninety-minute sessions. In order to serve the test writers properly, our Grade 11 and 12 students not writing the test are granted an Independent Study Day (at home) on April 2nd. Grade 9 classes will run as regularly scheduled.

LOCKDOWN DRILL

In order to maintain an atmosphere that addresses the safety of all members of our community we participated in our second Lockdown Drill of this school year, on **Thursday February 19**th. The purpose of this drill was to rehearse what staff and students should do in the unlikely event that a dangerous intruder invades our school; this practice is intended to inform and empower rather than alarm. We will continue to work with the City of Kingston Police as we refine our procedures which are designed to inform and empower all members of our community.

QUIT4LIFE-SMOKER'S CORNER

Terrie Hoey and KFLA Public Health Nurse **Lisa Lollar** are co-facilitating a **Q4L program** which will began in February and run each Tuesday until early **April** for a total of eight sessions. It takes more than will power to quit smoking? It takes skills and support, as well as motivation to quit. The Quit4Life (Q4L) is designed to help youth quit smoking... for life.

Q4L is organized around 4 central steps: **Get Psyched, Get Smart, Get Support, Get On With It.** Each week, students will be asked to complete 3-5 activities which will help them learn about why they smoke, how to quit and how to stay quit once you get there. Students will create their profile, store and save their completed activities, build a quitting calendar, track their smoking, sign up for reminders and messages, learn how to deal with stress, boredom and people who might not support them.

IMMUNIZATION MESSAGE

Students between the ages of 14 and 16 need a booster of tetanus, diphtheria and pertussis (dTaP) called Adacel. They are also eligible for Meningococcal C vaccine between the ages of 15 and 19. **KFL&A Public Health** will be holding clinics at all secondary schools in the new year. Our clinic will be held in April.

If your child receives a booster at the doctor's office, ask the office to send the information to **KFLA&A Public Health** or you may call the automated vaccine reporting line at **613-549-1232** ext. **445** or **1-800-267-7875** ext. **445** to give them an update.
