#### HOLY CROSS NON-SMOKING POLICY 2009 - 2010

Holy Cross students in **all grades** are prohibited from smoking or being in possession of tobacco or tobacco products at **Holy Cross this September**. The school and the **KFLA Health Unit** will continue to offer the **Quit 4 Life** smoking cessation classes in **2009-10**. Students who choose to break this rule will face suspension and a system of progressive discipline for failure to comply with the school's expectation. In connection with this, students will not be allowed to linger in groups on the path across from the school (or in other areas). The pathway has become an area of concern for us in terms of littering and safety, for our students and for community members. Expect that we will move groups of students away from the pathway. Also, students found smoking on school grounds may receive a bylaw infraction ticket, which prompts a fine of over three hundred dollars and a court visit. Make healthy and respectful choices, Holy Cross.

The completion of thirty (30) credits (including compulsories), forty (40) hours of Community involvement, and the successful completion of the literacy test, are the key components of the diploma requirements. The community involvement hours (40) were to be completed and submitted to Student Services in May. It is the student's responsibility to ensure that all requirements (including night school courses and on-line courses) have been completed or will be completed. The final marks for on-line and night school courses must be submitted to Student Services by **Monday, June 15<sup>th</sup>,2009**. Students are to contact their counsellor regarding any questions concerning graduation.

Congratulations to the following graduates, chosen by their peers as class representatives: Valedictorian, Lewis MacDonald; Salutatorian, John McCombs; and 2009 Class Representatives Josh Blackstock and Graham Slaughter.

Each graduate has received four tickets which are required by their family and guests at the door on the evening of **June 25<sup>th</sup>**. All graduates are reminded to notify Student Services once they have accepted admission to a college or university and if they have received any scholarships or bursaries.

The completion of forty (40) hours of Community involvement is required as a key component of the diploma requirements. The community involvement hours are to be completed and submitted to Student Services. If you still have not done your community involvement you need to see Student Services ASAP. – Last call – Friday June 5<sup>th</sup>.

Graduating students who applied for admission to an Ontario university who did not receive an offer of admission can inquire about possible openings at other Ontario universities through the OUAC. Go to <u>www.ouac.on.ca</u>. To be considered students must have completed 6 4U or 4M courses including the prerequisites needed for entry to specific programs.

Student timetables for the 2009-2010 school year were handed out on Friday, May 29<sup>th</sup>. Students are asked to connect with Student Services as soon as possible to deal with any necessary changes. It is the intent of Student Services to have timetable problems/changes resolved by the end of exams. Students who intend to switch from applied courses (English/Science) in Grade 9 to academic in Grade 10 are reminded that completion of a "crossover material" package is strongly recommended (switching from applied to academic Math involves summer school). Please see your counsellor for details. Senior students are required to complete a "half credit" transfer course (Summer School) in order to switch from applied to university/ college (English/Math/Science).

#### Summer School Information

Summer School will operate at **Bayridge Secondary School** this summer beginning on **July 6<sup>th</sup>** and concluding on **July 31<sup>st</sup>**. Summer school is operated by the two Boards of Education in the Kingston Area: Limestone and our own Algonquin and Lakeshore Catholic District School Board. Further information regarding Summer school is available in Student Services. **Students may choose to take courses to improve on a mark already achieved or enroll in a new credit course.** Summer school applications are expected in Student Services any day now. **Students must see their counsellor to obtain this information.** 

#### PH CLASSIC UPDATE

#### JUNE TEXTBOOK RETURNS

Textbooks issued by Holy Cross are the property of the school and are on loan to a student on a semester basis only. The majority of students are responsible users of their textbooks nonetheless, at this time of year it is well to remind all users of school policy. Books are costly to replace and are sometimes unavailable for purchase. Students are reminded that it is their responsibility to care for their books and to return all items in good condition. Mixups can occur in classrooms, and a student may inadvertently have another person's textbook in their possession. Students are responsible for returning the textbooks assigned to them. Please search your house, car, locker, etc. for any textbooks which may not have been returned. The school needs these missing copies. HC textbooks are due back on the day of the individual student's final exam. Students are to personally return the textbooks they were issued (exact barcodes) to the Textbook Room or to the Library, to ensure that their account is cleared. Textbooks left in the classroom or exam room remain the student's responsibility. The \$100.00 deposit cheques will be cashed for unreturned or damaged books beginning June 26<sup>th</sup>. After that date no information or refunds will be available until school starts in September. If there are any questions about textbooks, please call Mr. Mario Cortis or Miss Mary Pryal at extension 3413, before then.

#### AUGUST TEXTBOOK PICK-UP

Students will be able to pick up their next year's first semester text books as of the last week in August. The textbook room will be open on Tuesday, August 25th to Thursday, August 27th from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m., and Thursday evening from 6-9 p.m.. (Tuesday, August 25th is reserved as a "Grade 9 only" day. Only the new grade 9 students will be served on that day.) Other students can pick up their books on the other days. In order to get textbooks each student's account of the previous year must be clear. Students must have their green textbook card to be validated. (New grade 9 students will be given their cards at textbook pickup time.) A separate textbook deposit cheque must be submitted. This cheque is to be made out to Holy Cross Secondary School, in the amount of \$100.00 post dated to March 1st, 2010, and should have the student's full name printed at the top left of the cheque. Please be advised that any textbook account problems that have not been resolved from the previous semester will not be able to be addressed during the busy textbook pick-up days. Replacement green textbook cards are \$5.00 and cannot be issued the same day. In order to avoid delays, please ensure that all textbooks are returned on time.
