## **EcoCorner**

Due to the hard work of our students, staff, and the HC Green Team, Holy Cross is a newly Silver-certified Ontario Ecoschool. As part of our environmental efforts, we encourage all students and staff to use the paper and container recycling bins provided in the classrooms and hallways, as well as the collection center for used batteries, cell phones, ink cartridges, and eye glasses lo-

cated on the way to the gym, across from **Room 129.** We encourage the use of tap water in reusable bottles, and thanks to a gift from the graduating class of 2009, a new chilled and filtered drinking water fountain will be installed near the main foyer, making it easier to refill water bottles. We invite everyone to get involved in our green efforts and help Holy Cross reduce the human impact on the environment.

## **Transportation**

All students and parents/guardians are reminded to record their bus number and bus company in case of inclement weather or emergencies. The Triboard Transportation website, <a href="http://www.triboard.on.ca/">http://www.triboard.on.ca/</a>, will provide parents who register with them up-to-date information on any delays or cancellations for their children's buses.

# Smoking Restrictions - All Students

Students in every grade are prohibited from smoking at Holy Cross. Therefore, students are not allowed to gather in the former smoking area and are not allowed to be in possession of cigarettes or tobacco products. Students are also reminded to be courteous to our neighbours. Gatherings off-campus, which can be bothersome both in terms of noise and littering, will not be condoned. If a student is found to be smoking or to be in possession of cigarettes, he or she will be given a warning. There will be a progression of consequences for subsequent infractions, including suspension from school. Smoking is the number one preventable cause of premature death and disease in Ontario.

# **Smoking and Student Gathering Areas**

It is the policy of our School Board that smoking is not allowed on the property and it is a distinct expectation that all will respect this policy. We recognize that the decision to smoke or not to smoke is an individual one, but we sincerely hope that in the face of mounting evidence with regard to the risk of our health that anyone thinking about beginning or ending "the habit" will give it serious thought. Smoking on the property will result in fines by the **Health Unit's Tobacco Enforcement Officer** who regularly patrols the area. Students wanting to quit smoking should listen for further information about our **Quit4Life program**, to be implemented later in the fall, or can visit www.quit4life.com to find out more information.

#### Fire Drills and Lock Down Drills

In order to maintain our students safety it is necessary for students to practice Fire Drill and Lock Down. According to our Board Policy we will be participating in three Fire Drills per semester and one Lock Down Drill. The first Fire Drill will occur on **Tuesday, September 15**th and the other two to follow in late September and early October. Our Lock Down Drill this semester will occur in October. There will be more information about Lock Downs in the October Newsletter.

# **Medical Information**

# **Terry Fox Run**

This year the 29<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the **Terry Fox Run for Cancer Research** will be held on **Sunday, September 13**<sup>th</sup> starting at **1:00 p.m**. In past years, Holy Cross has been awarded the **Barry Brady Trophy** for having the largest number of participants participating in the Terry Fox Run at **St. Lawrence College**. Since Terry's run in 1980, there has been great progress in cancer research:

- Almost 60% of people diagnosed with cancer in Canada today will survive.
- Incidence rates for most cancers are stabilizing or declining.
- Death rates for childhood cancers have fallen by more than 50% since the 1950s.
- Cancer treatments are more effective and have fewer side effects. Hopefully, we can all contribute to this worthy cause and walk, run, bike, or roll as participants in this great Canadian tradition.

# 2009 - 2010 Crusader Student Activity Fee

The student activity fee covers the Holy Cross Agenda, the Students' Council ID Card, a Holy Cross Spirit T-shirt or backpack (a new addition this year!), two Twoonie for Non-Uni Days, and a 2009 – 2010 Holy Cross Yearbook. Students from Grades 10 – 12 must pay \$66.00. Graduating students will pay \$101.00, which includes the Grad Fee and Grad disc. The Grade Nine rate is \$85.00, which also includes a French Cahier and a school lock. Students may opt out of receiving the yearbook by signing the "opt out" form. For parents with more than one child at Holy Cross, a reduction of \$4.00 per additional child is available when purchasing a yearbook. At press time, nearly 1200 students (and / or their families) have paid their student activity fee – fantastic! The value of the items purchased individually is much greater than the actual comprehensive fee. By ordering in bulk, Holy Cross is able to pass the savings on to the community. Therefore, Students' Council is better able to support the extra-curriculars that make Holy Cross such an easy place to get involved.

## **Holy Cross Athletics**

The fall of 2009 sees the return of a strong extracurricular athletics program at **Holy Cross**. Tryouts and practices begin the first week of September. This fall will see no less than eight teams carrying the green and silver of **Holy Cross**. The commitment of our student athletes and coaches generates dividends for all in our community. The parental support our teams have grown accustomed to over the years is most welcomed and appreciated. Grade 9 students should not hesitate to get involved. There are a wide range of teams to join and all are age-appropriate. High school sports are a great way to develop lasting friendships while learning and developing many skills. The values, beliefs and invaluable life skills which school sports provide allow our student-athletes the opportunity to fully develop themselves. If you have any questions regarding a team, contact one of the coaches or see your homeroom or physical and health education teacher.

OFSAA operates with a Five Year Eligibility and a Transfer Eligibility Rule. Student-athletes now have a maximum of five years of eligibility to compete in high school athletics. Any student who has transferred into Holy Cross from another high school remains ineligible for all sports until they go through the transfer appeal process and are ruled upon. Any transfer student should contact Mr. Tim Hunter, Athletic Director to begin the appeal process. The costs of running an extracurricular athletic program are great. Our teams are most fortunate to have the financial support of the Holy Cross Students' Council. Even with this support, user fees are required for all sports at Holy Cross. User fees for individual teams are listed in the Holy Cross Student Agenda and are due in full for all athletes before their first competition. Have a great season and we hope to see you on the sidelines supporting the Green and Silver Crusaders of HC

# **Attendance at Holy Cross**

At Holy Cross, we are very concerned that all students realize their full potential. Our direct expectation is that students attend all of their classes in uniform and complete work that is assigned. We will make every effort to keep parents aware of any problems with respect to attendance as it relates to their child. Parents can expect contact by the Attendance Secretary and/or Administration to verify student absences. Teachers will contact parents about learning issues related to attendance. We are very concerned with ensuring that no student is unsuccessful as a result of irregular attendance. In order to accomplish this goal, the following procedures will be followed: 1. Attendance will be taken during each class. All student absences will be checked. If you know that your child is going to be away, please call the Attendance Office at 613-384-1355. Otherwise, the Attendance Secretary or Administration will be contacting you at your home or your place of business. If no call has been received from the parent, the student must bring a note the next day explaining their absence. If they fail or forget to do so, the student may be assigned Study Hall time. 2. All students who are absent from school or any class during the day who cannot satisfactorily account for their absence (normally by bringing a note signed by their parent, guardian or a doctor's certificate) will be required to make up missed time by attending Study Hall during the first half of lunch. 3. If a student misses a study hall session to which they have been assigned without a satisfactory excuse, they meet with an administrator. Subsequent failure to attend study hall or ongoing problems of irregular attendance will be dealt with in a progressively more serious manner, which will most likely include suspension after consultation with parents/guardians.

## **Punctuality**

All students are expected to be on time for period one and each subject class. Punctuality demonstrates consideration and respect for others. If you are late you interrupt the classroom learning environment, inconvenience the teacher and class causing unnecessary additional work for all. Sometimes lateness is unavoidable and may be excused. However, students who are repeatedly late will be subject to the discipline policy of the school. Study Halls (lunch period detentions) or suspension from the school may occur.
