Congratulations to members of **C.I.C.S**. who were part of this year's **Toronto Street Retreat** from **November 16 – 17**<sup>th</sup>. The students worked with the homeless on the streets of **Toronto**, talked with refugees at **Romero House** and volunteered either at **St. Francis Table** or **St. Felix Centre** where they helped prepare and serve inexpensive, nutritious meals to underprivileged people. One of the participants, writes of her experience: "This experience has been so eye-opening. It has completely changed my outlook on the homeless and made me rethink my future." All agreed this was an "eye-opening" experience of what it is like to be homeless and poor on the streets of our largest city.

This year's Advent Food Drive will once again involve our Home form classes in collecting money to provide Christmas Dinner and toys for local families through the Salvation Army's Christmas Hamper Campaign. Each of our Hampers will be delivered personally by Students' Council and CICS to the homes of our 'adopted' families on Friday, December 18th. In this time of economic crisis, even more people are facing financial hardships. So, I encourage everyone to give generously this year to this and other local charities which are struggling to help the many people who are coming to them seeking food, clothing and adequate shelter. This is a time to recognize God's presence in the poor and marginalized of our society – and to accept our responsibility to help them in any way that we can. The Minister of Training Colleges and Universities recently announced the government has passed legislation to establish the 'Ontario College of Trades'. He indicated this will be a regulatory college to modernize the province's apprenticeship and skilled trades system, and that it will put the skilled trades on similar footing with teachers, doctors and nurses, who have their own regulatory colleges.

What is an Apprenticeship? – An apprenticeship is a hands-on training program for people who want to work in skilled trades or occupations. About 90% of an apprenticeship involves on-the-job training by employers; the remaining 10% involves theoretical training at a college or with a training provider.

How long does an Apprenticeship last? – Most apprenticeships take 2-5 years, depending on the trade. There are usually 2 or 3 in-college training segments associated with the overall apprenticeship term.


Can a student start an apprenticeship while attending high school? - Yes! The Ontario Youth Apprenticeship Program (OYAP) provides opportunities for senior students (grades 11 and 12) to become registered apprentices while finishing high school. Does the ALCDSB have any examples of OYAP student involvement? - Yes! Over the past 5 years there has been significant interest and growth in OYAP enrollment. For example, in 2008-09, 242 students were enrolled in cooperative education placements in skilled trade areas. Of this group, 46 students were formally registered as apprentices with employers, and 35 received their Level 1 apprenticeship training at either St. Lawrence College, Loyalist College or Local 183. Note: College tuition fees for OYAP students enrolled in the Carpentry, Hairstylist, Brick and Stone Mason, Automotive, Cook, Early Childhood Education, and Construction Craft Worker programs are paid for by MTCU. How do high school students get involved? – Information about OYAP may be obtained from the guidance departments or cooperative education teachers in any of the Board's high schools. Who Should Consider OYAP? - Students who:

- •Are at least 16 years of age and have completed 16 credits
- •Are either in grade 11 or 12 and have an interest in a career in a skilled trade
