# HC COMMUNICATIONS TECHNOLOGY STUDENTS WIN IN SKILLS COMPETITIONS!

Holy Cross Grade 11 Communications Technology students Ashley Roddy and Jamie Gillespie won first place in the Limestone Skills Competition in the Television / Video Production category. On Wednesday, March 31st, more than 400 students and 75 judges showcased the skills, attitudes and talents required to apply and succeed in Technological Education and careers. TV / Video production students were given the specific task to complete a public service announcement (P.S.A.) television commercial promoting Earth Day 2010, from start to finish, within the predetermined time frame of 5 hours, which was judged by industry professionals from CKWS TV. The annual competition is an excellent opportunity for students to demonstrate their technical talent and artistic creativity putting all of their skills to the test against their peers and current industry standards. Ashley and Jamie qualified to advance to the Eastern Regional Provincial Skills Canada Competition.

Holy Cross won second place in the Eastern Regional Skills Canada Competition on Saturday, April 17th, also hosted by St. Lawrence College. Holy Cross scored 94.71, and the first place team from Brockville scored 94.8 %, a difference of only . 0 9 % !!! The HC team had to video record, edit, write music, and generate graphics for a "Stop Bullying" PSATV commercial in 3.5 hours.. The Holy Cross students are the only Kingston area school team to qualify and advance to the Provincial Video / Television Skills Canada Competition in Waterloo, Ontario, on Monday, May 17 to 19th to compete against the "best-of-the-best" 42 students from across the province.

Ashley Roddy and Jamie Gillespie are also enrolled in the Holy Cross SHSM program (Specialist High Skills Major) in Information and Communications Technology (I.C.T.). Holy Cross is the only Kingston area school that is Ministry of Education approved to offer this specialized I.C.T. program. SHSM students customize their secondary school studies to focus on audio & video production, graphic design, photography, and web site design. The SHSM program has 5 components students complete; senior communications technology courses, 6 certifications (CPR, First Aid, etc...), Cooperative education work placement, Ontario Skills Passport on-line activity, and "Reach Ahead" experiences in the student's post-secondary school studies destination. SHSM students graduate with a special SHSM red stamp on their Ontario Secondary School Diploma. SHSM designation on their student transcript provides students with an advantage in college, university or workplace admission.

Congratulations to Grade 11 Communications Technology students for winning first & second place in the **St. Lawrence College** Advertising/ Marketing/Public Relations student media production awards in the secondary school category. **Eric DeSousa** and **Rebecca Linderman** won first place for their public service announcement on wife abuse entitled "Daddy's Coming Home". Second place was won by **Sam Lague, Ian Marshall**, and **Tori McAllister** for their wife abuse PSA "Is This Love?".

### **ECO-CORNER**

April was a great month for 'green' activities at Holy Cross. During Earth Week, grade level assemblies entitled 'We've got the Power' were held in the cafetorium. This year's 25 minute presentation focused on reducing our carbon footprint by making smart choices in our energy use, the things we buy, and the food we eat. During the week, we also hosted a visit from the two coordinators of the Kingston Sustainability Centre as well as students from the environmental club at St. Marguerite Bourgeoys elementary. Over 30 classes also participated in the 'Calculate your Carbon Footprint' and 'Act of Green' activities. With the excellent help of several grade 9 classes, we also completed a garbage audit. The results revealed that only 32% of our garbage was actual waste. The rest was made up of paper (23%), recyclable containers (24%), and compostable waste (21%). A final energy audit also found that over 90% of lights and about 75% of monitors are being turned off when not in use. This is a drastic improvement from the fall! We would like to thank all staff and students that were involved in the Earth Week celebrations. Keep it green, HC!

**Eco-tip:** Did you know that one cheeseburger results in the production 3-6 kg of greenhouse gasses? This large carbon footprint comes from the different stages of cattle growth, transportation, and refrigeration. Try following the **David Suzuki Foundation** challenge to Canadians to eat

a meat-free meal once a week. Your planet and body will thank you!
