ECO-CORNER

Thank you to all members of the greater community for dropping off their items at the electronic waste collection held at Holy Cross. Despite the rain and wind, the school collected over 3000 items. This waste will be recycled in a environmentally responsible way right here in Ontario. If you have other e-waste you wish to drop off, please visit the City of Kingston website for a list of locations that will accept these items. In addition to being involved in the ewaste collection, the HC Green Team has been busy completing our certification requirements for EcoSchools Ontario. A recent audit of our waste and recycling found that approximately 23 kg of waste is generated per student each year. On the positive side, we recycle approximately 14 kg of waste per student each year. A final energy audit also found that over 90% of lights and and monitors are being turned off when not in use. This is a significant improvement from the fall. We would like to thank all staff and students that were involved in making HC a greener school. Keep it green, HC!

Eco-tip: Think before you throw it out! Many items we see as waste can be used by someone else or recycled into new items.

Co-op Program: July 4 – 29. 4 week co-op program (one credit) will be offered if there is sufficient enrolment.

SCHOOL TEXTBOOKS

We are very pleased with the responsible way in which students are dealing with textbooks. As we have requested, students are bringing in books needing repair. Prevention like this avoids students having to pay charges for repair or replacement at the end of term. It is the student's responsibility to personally return the textbooks they were **issued** to the **Textbook Room** to ensure that their account is cleared. **Do not** leave textbooks in the classroom or exam room. **Holy Cross textbooks are due back no later than the day of the individual student's last exam.**

GRADUATING CLASS OF 2011

This year's graduation ceremony will be held on **Tuesday**, **June 28**th beginning at **7 p.m.** at the school. A **Graduation Mass** will be celebrated by **Father René Labelle** at **St. Paul the Apostle Church** on **Taylor-Kidd Blvd** at **12:00 p.m.** for the graduates, their families and friends and staff. All teachers are asked to please mark this date on their calendar.

Community Involvement Hours

A number of projected graduates have not completed Community Involvement Hours. Documentation is to be submitted to Student Services by **Friday, May 13**th. So get to it!

Following is a list of students who, at this point, are *potential* graduates and eligible to take part in the **June 2011** graduation ceremony. The completion of thirty (30) credits (including compulsories) forty (40) hours of Community involvement and the successful completion of the literacy test, are the key components of the diploma requirements. The community involvement hours (40) are to be completed and submitted to Student Services by *Friday, May 13th*, **2011**. It is *the student's responsibility* to ensure that *all* requirements (including night school courses and on-line courses) have been completed or will be completed. The final marks for on-line and night school courses must be submitted to Student Services by *Monday, June 13th*, **2011**. Please contact your counsellor if you have any concerns.
