GRADE 9 ASSESSMENT OF MATHEMATICS

For those who are currently registered in Grade 9 Academic and Applied Mathematics courses, the **Grade 9 EQAO Assessment of Academic Mathematics** will be written on **Tuesday, June 14th** and on **Wednesday, June 15th** in regularly scheduled math classes. Some applied students may be eligible for an exam exemption should they achieve the provincial standard on this test and throughout the semester; teachers will notify qualifying students directly in advance of our final exams.

A list of students who are potential graduates of Holy Cross and eligible to receive their Ontario Secondary School Diploma and take part in the June 2011 graduation ceremony was published in the May 2011 Newsletter. The completion of thirty (30) credits (including compulsories), forty (40) hours of Community involvement, and the successful completion of the literacy test, are the key components of the diploma requirements. The community involvement hours (40) were to be completed and submitted to Student Services by May. It is the student's responsibility to ensure that all requirements (including night school courses and on-line courses) have been completed or will be completed. The final marks for on-line and night school courses must be submitted to Student Services by **Monday, June 13th, 2011**.

Students are encouraged to contact their counselor regarding any questions concerning graduation. Congratulations to the following graduates, chosen by their peers as class representatives: **Valedictorian, Ciara Roberts; Salutatorian, Mike Vermeesch; and 2011 Class Representatives Eden Cameron and Derek Fox.**

Each graduate has received four tickets which are required by their family and guests at the door on the evening of **June 28th**. All graduates are reminded to notify Student Services once they have accepted admission to a college or university and if they have received any scholarships or bursaries.

This year each graduate who has paid their **Crusader Student Activity Fee** will receive a photo CD, containing images from the graduation ceremonies. The CD will include the large group photograph, graduates receiving their diplomas, and award winners.

JUNE TEXTBOOK RETURNS

Textbooks issued by Holy Cross are the property of the school and are on loan to a student on a semester basis only. The majority of students are responsible users of their textbooks nonetheless, at this time of year it is well to remind all users of school policy. Books are costly to replace and are sometimes unavailable for purchase. Students are reminded that it is their responsibility to care for their books and to return all items

in good condition. Mix-ups can occur in classrooms, and a student may inadvertently have another person's textbook in their possession. Students are responsible for returning the textbooks assigned to them. Please search your house, car, locker, etc. for any textbooks which may not have been returned. The school needs these missing copies. **HC textbooks are due back on the day of the individual student's final exam.** Students are to personally **return the textbooks they were issued (exact barcodes)** to the Textbook Room or to the Library, to ensure that their account is cleared. Textbooks left in the classroom or exam room remain the student's responsibility. The \$100.00 deposit cheques will be cashed for unreturned or damaged books beginning **June 27th**. After that date no information or refunds will be available until school starts in September. If there are any questions about textbooks, please call **Mr. Mario Cortis** or **Miss Mary Pryal** at **extension 3413**, before then.

AUGUST TEXTBOOK PICK-UP

Students will be able to pick up their next year's first semester text books during the week before classes begin. The textbook room will be open from **Tuesday, August 30th to Thursday, September 1st from 9 – 3 pm**, and the **Wednesday evening** also from **6 – 9 pm**. (**Tuesday, August 30th** is reserved as a **"Grade 9 only"**. Only the new grade 9 students will be served on that day.) Other students can pick up their books on the other days. In order to get textbooks each student's account of the previous year must be clear. Students must have their green textbook card to be validated. (New grade 9 students will be given their cards at textbook pickup time.) A separate textbook deposit cheque must be submitted. This cheque is to be made out to **Holy Cross Secondary School**, in the amount of **\$100.00** post dated to **March 1st, 2012**, and should have the student's **full name** printed at the top left of the cheque. Please be advised that any textbook account problems that have not been resolved from the previous semester will not be able to be addressed during the busy textbook pick-up days. Replacement green textbook cards are \$5.00 and cannot be issued the same day. In order to avoid delays, please ensure that all textbooks are returned on time.

ECO-CORNER

In the month of May, the Green Team spent some time outdoors working on our green spaces. Thank you to the students of Mr. Jeff Brady's class for helping plant 30 trees on the school property. This school yard greening project will serve the dual purpose of providing some habitat for animals and shade for future students and members of the community attending outside events.

With support with a grant from Metro grocers, the green team has also been busy planting a flower and vegetable garden located near the portables. The harvest from this garden is planned to be donated to the local food bank. Compost collected from the cafeteria staff this year will be used to provide nutrients to the garden next year. Graduate Information

The completion of forty (40) hours of Community involvement is required as a key component of the diploma requirements. The community involvement hours are to be completed and submitted to Student Services. If you still have not done your community involvement you need to see Student Services ASAP. – Last call – **Friday June 3rd**.

Graduating students who applied for admission to an Ontario university who did not receive an offer of admission can inquire about possible openings at other Ontario universities through the **OUAC** from **June 8th to August 26th**. Go to www.ouac.on.ca or call 519-823-1063.

To be considered students must have completed 6 4U or 4M courses including the prerequisites needed for entry to specific programs, as well as an average of at least 60%.

Student timetables for the **2011- 2012** school year will be available online on Friday June 3rd. Students can access their timetable by using the **Maplewood Portal** on the **HC Today website**. Student timetables will not be mailed over the summer. A copy will be available in the text book room during text book pick up in late August. It is the intent of Student Services to have timetable problems/changes resolved by the end of exams. Students who intend to switch from applied courses in Grade 9 to academic in Grade 10 are reminded that they need to complete the prerequisite course. Senior students wishing to upgrade also require the appropriate prerequisite. Please see your counselor for details.

Summer School Information

The **Algonquin Lakeshore Catholic District School Board** is offering summer school courses in the following options:

Credit Improvement: July 4 – 15: 55 hours of credit improvement will be available for students achieving 35% or greater. Summer school will be offered at Holy Cross, numbers permitting. Transportation will not be available.

New Credit: July 4 – 29: Students can take a new credit through online learning. E-learning courses include: ENG4C, ENG4U, ENG3U, PPZ3O, GLC2O, CHV2O, MCR3U, HSB4M, and MHF4U. All university level e-learning courses will include a final exam held on July 29th.

Coop Program: July 4 – 29: A four week coop program (one credit) is offered if numbers permit. Pre-employment training will be done online.
