EQAO GRADE NINE ASSESSMENT OF MATHEMATICS

In January 2012, Holy Cross students who are currently enrolled in a Grade 9 Applied or Academic Mathematics course will join others in a provincewide standardized Grade Nine Math Test. This mandatory assessment will involve multiple choice questions, short answer and extended responses. This test will be administered on Tuesday and Wednesday, January 17 and 18th, 2012. Please note that for students in the academic program, this accounts for ten per cent of their final mark; for students in the applied level, an exemption from final exam may take place if they: 1) have term work at level three or four, 2) submit an EQAO review book at level three or four, and 3) score level three or four on the EQAO assess¬ment. Teachers will inform their students of exemptions prior to final exams.

Ontario Youth Apprenticeship Program

"The skilled trades are more important to **Ontario's** future than ever before. Establishing the **College of Trades** recognizes the

sector's professionalism, and will help Ontario produce the skilled work¬ers we need to compete in tomorrow's economy." – John Milloy, Minister of Training Colleges and Universities (October 27th, 2009). The Minister of Training Colleges and Universities recently announced the government has passed legislation to establish the 'Ontario College of Trades'. He indicated this will be a regulatory college to modernize the province's apprenticeship and skilled trades system, and that it will put the skilled trades on similar footing with teachers, doctors and nurses, who have their own regulatory colleges.

What is an Apprenticeship? – An apprenticeship is a hands-on training program for people who want to work in skilled trades or occupations. About 90% of an apprenticeship involves on-the-job training by employers; the remaining 10% involves theoretical training at a college or with a training provider.

How long does an Apprenticeship last? – Most apprenticeships take 2-5 years, depending on the trade.

Can a student start an apprenticeship while attending high school? – Yes! The Ontario Youth Apprenticeship Program (OYAP) provides opportunities for senior students (grades 11 and 12) to become registered apprentices while finishing high school.

Does the ALCDSB have any examples of OYAP student involvement? – Yes! Over the past 5 years there has been significant interest and growth in OYAP enrollment. For example, in 2008-09, 242 students were enrolled in cooperative education placements in skilled trade areas. Of this group, 46 students were formally registered as apprentices with employers, and 35 received their Level 1 apprenticeship training at either St. Lawrence College, Loyalist College or Local 183. Note: College tuition fees for OYAP students enrolled in the Carpentry, Hairstylist, Brick and Stone Mason, Automotive, Cook, Early Childhood Education, and Construction Craft Worker programs are paid for by MTCU.

How do high school students get involved? – Information about OYAP may be obtained from the guidance departments or cooperative education teachers. (Web information at www.oyap.com) Who Should Consider OYAP? - Students who:

- •Are at least 16 years of age and have completed 16 credits
- ·Have an interest in a career in a skilled trade
