Graduate Information

The completion of forty (40) hours of community involvement is required as a key component of the diploma requirements. The community involvement hours are to be completed and submitted to **Student Services**. If you still have not done your community involvement you need to see **Student Services** ASAP. – Last call – **Friday, June 8th**.

Graduating students who applied for admission to an **Ontario** university, who did not receive an offer of admission, can inquire about possible openings at other **Ontario** universities through the **OUAC** from **June 6th to August 31st**. Go to www.ouac.on.ca or call **519-823-1063**. To be considered, students must have completed 6 4U or 4M courses including the prerequisites needed for entry to specific programs, as well as an average of at least 60%.

Student timetables for the **2012-2013** school year will be available online on **Friday, June 8th**. Summer School Information

The **Algonquin Lakeshore Catholic District School Board** is offering summer school courses in the following options:

Credit Improvement: July 4 – 17: 55 hours of credit improvement will be available for students achieving 35% or greater. Summer school will be offered at **Holy Cross**, numbers permitting. Transportation will not be available.

New Credit: July 4 – 31: Students can take a new credit through on-line learning. E-learning courses include: ENG4C, ENG4U, ENG3U, PPZ3O, GLC2O, CHV2O, MPM2D, MCR3U, MCF3M, MHF4U, and HHS4M. All university level e-learning courses will include a final exam held on **July 31st**.

Co-op Program: July 4 – 31: A four week co-op program (one credit) is offered if numbers permit. Pre-employment training will be done online.

The completion of thirty (30) credits (including compulsories), forty (40) hours of Community involvement, and the

successful completion of the literacy test, are the key components of the diploma requirements. It is the student's responsibility to ensure that all requirements (including night school courses and on-line courses) have been completed or will be completed. The final marks for on-line and night school courses must be submitted to **Student Services** by **Wednesday, June 20th, 2012**.

Students are encouraged to contact their counsellor regarding any questions concerning graduation. Congratulations to the following graduates, chosen by their peers as class representatives: **Valedictorian, Michael McConnell; Salutatorian, Nick Cotman; and 2012 Class Representatives, Jeff Arnold and Tyler Check.**

Each graduate has received four tickets which are required by their family and guests at the door on the evening of **June 28th**. All graduates are reminded to notify Student Services once they have accepted admission to a college or university and if they have received any scholarships or bursaries.

This year each graduate who has paid their **Crusader Student Activity Fee** will receive a photo CD, containing images from the graduation ceremonies. The CD will include the large group photograph, graduates receiving their diplomas, and award winners.

Post-Secondary Education Transition Planning: After accepting entrance to college/university of your choice, students on IEPs make an appointment with their **Centre for Disabilities** to share their **Individual Education Plan** and all assessments to access accommodations. There is still time to update the IEP to reflect the **Strengths, Needs and Accommodation Sections** with the student's current learning profile. Identification, Placement and Review Committee Letters were mailed to Parents/Guardians. If you have already returned the Request/Waiver Meeting Forms, thank you; if not, please return these forms so that they be sent to **ALCDSB Office, Napanee (Ontario Ministry of Education requirement)**.

New TPM IEP Individual Education Plan: The new **TPM IEP** is to be sent to Parents/Guardians with the **June Report Card**.

Final Exams for Students on IEPs Your child's use of accommodations during the semester are entered by subject teachers on the "**Accommodation Form /Exam Form**" and returned to **Special Education**. Teachers may invite students who use "quiet location" and "time only" to write with their class or in **Resource Room 117**. Any change to the assessment is recorded in the Review section of the IEP. An "**Exam Conflict**" for students on IEPs at **Holy Cross** means that a student is writing two exams on one day. **Mrs. Marie Hulse, SERT**, coordinates this process with both subject teachers, student and **Mr. P. Melim, Vice-Principal**. **Mrs. Hulse** may be reached at **613-384-1919, ext.3428**.

Grade 9 EQAO Math Assessment - A letter has been mailed to you outlining your child's accommodations. The accommodations outlined in the letter are the ones that the student has requested and agreed to use (all accommodations were offered as outlined in the IEP, but the student may have agreed to some and declined others). LOCKER CLEAN-UP AND CLEAN-OUT PROCEDURES

All students must clear and clean their locker of personal belongings on the day of their final examination or at the latest, before the end of the day on **Tuesday, June 26th**. In the last week of **June**, locks will be seized and lockers will be cleared of all contents with items being donated.

JUNE TEXTBOOK RETURNS

Textbooks issued by Holy Cross are the property of the school and are on loan to a student on a semester basis only. Students are reminded that it is their responsibility to care for their books and to return all items in good condition. Mix-ups can occur in classrooms, and a student may inadvertently have another person's textbook in their possession. Students are responsible for returning the textbooks assigned to them. Please search your house, car, locker, etc. for any textbooks which may not have been returned. **HC textbooks are due back on the day of the individual student's final exam.** Students are to personally **return the textbooks they were issued (exact barcodes)** to the **Textbook Room** or to the **Library**, to ensure that their account is cleared. Textbooks left in the classroom or exam room remain the student's responsibility. The \$100.00 deposit cheques will be cashed for unreturned or damaged books beginning **June 27th**. After that date no information or refunds will be available until school starts in **September**. AUGUST TEXTBOOK PICK-UP

Students will be able to pick up their next year's first semester text books during the week before classes begin. The textbook room will be open from **Tuesday, August 28th to Thursday, August 30th** from **9 – 3 pm**, and the **Wednesday evening** also from **6 – 9 pm**. (**Tuesday, August 28th** is reserved as a **"Grade 9 only"**. Only the new grade 9 students will be served on that day.) Other students can pick up their books on the other days. In order to get textbooks each student's account of the previous year must be clear. Students must have their green textbook card to be validated. (New grade 9 students will be given their cards at textbook pickup time.) A separate textbook deposit cheque must be submitted. This cheque is to be made out to **Holy Cross Secondary School**, in the amount of **\$100.00** postdated to **March 1st, 2013**, and should have the student's **full name** printed at the top left of the cheque. *Please be advised that any textbook account problems that have not been resolved from the previous semester will not be able to be addressed during the busy textbook pick-up days. Replacement green textbook cards are \$5.00 and cannot be issued the same day. I*
